In English we have been making some tasty tomato bruschetta in

class. The ingredients that we used were: half of a small red onion, finely chopped, eight medium tomatoes (about 500g), coarsely chopped and drained, 2-3 garlic cloves, crushed, 6-8 leaves of fresh basil, finely chopped, 60-80ml extra virgin olive oil, 1 loaf crusty bread.

The activities were football, bouncy castles for 3-7 years old and 8-12 years old, henna and face painting, etc. The foods/treats/drinks that there were to eat are listed in the following: hot dogs, candy floss, popcorn, fizzy drinks, water etc. The raffle ticket winners were announced at 4:00pm; there were so many lucky winners.

The triangle

You are probably wondering what the triangle is? Well, it is our school's local community garden; we met two gardeners who gave us partners and a work sheet. We had to find out if there were the same flowers or plants in our garden but there was a difference in one of them... it was the black kale. We also are learning about basil in English as you probably would know. They gave us another sheet which tells us information about herbs for cooking, flavouring and healing. Basil is a good source of vitamin A, vitamin C and minerals. It is also very tasty in sauces like pesto which goes well with pasta. It can be grown outside in this country in summer. Basil leaves can be picked regularly and the plant will still grow if watered every day.




