

# Year 5's Blog



In English we have finally finished our big unit of work: the study of a significant fictional text. Our text was called Floodland and the author's name is Marcus Sedgwick. The book is about a girl called Zoe;

she lost her parents whilst trying to board the last rescue ship from her island: Norwich (named after a real place in England). The island was being drowned by the water as the sea levels were rising at an extreme speed. We discovered in the final chapter that Zoe was finally reunited with her parents after quite an adventure. She met her baby brother and called him William, which is named after a friend of hers in the story who possibly died. If I had to rate the story out of a ten I would rate it a ten out of ten!

Here are some questions we explored upon finishing the novel:

Think of yourself as a spectator. With whose eyes did you see the story?

Did you only see what one character in the story saw, or did you see things sometimes as one character saw them as sometimes as another and so on?

Which character interested you the most?

Did any of the characters remind you of people you know? Or remind you of characters in other books?

In Art we have been using watercolours to consider the rich imagery of water from Floodland. Moreover, we have watched some FANTASTIC videos about artistic techniques, such as wet-on-wet, wet-on-dry, blotting, erasing colour and creating a ripple effect. For the art, most students used the colours: green, blue, yellow, purple and many more.

This week we had visitors from Vietnam who participated in our classes. On Tuesday we had fun with the Vietnamese visitors in Holland Park - we played foot-

Please may we remind parents not to double park opposite our school gate. Double parking here is causing a risk to the safety of our children.


#### **Notice to Parents**


