Year 5's Blog

In science we have begun a new topic about forces, and the different kinds of forces in our universe. The science of physics all started with forces. A force isn't something you can touch – it's more of an idea. A pretty simple idea too: a force is just a push or a pull, like a footballer kicking a ball. Examples of some forces are: gravity, air resistance, friction, applied force, reaction force and buoyancy. We

also wrote the recipe for our potato soup. We learnt about the difference between ounces and grams. Ounces are an imperial measurement and grams are metric. There are around 25 grams in one ounce.

In English we have been reading on in our text 'Cloud Busting' by Malorie Blackman. This week, we have been writing shape poems; shape poems take the shape of a relevant object. Firstly, we wrote shape poems on a scrap piece of paper, then we rewrote it in our English books and made a real shape poem, making it neat as possible. Our shape poem was the outline of a person, to be precise, Sam, who is a bully. We considered how the bully appears to be, and wrote this on the outside of our poems. Then, we identified feelings and motivations of the bully and wrote these on the inside of the outline to form our poem.

In Maths we have been learning about Roman numerals and what the numbers mean. We also found out that at every ending (the credits) of a BBC programme, the current year is displayed in Roman numerals (MMXIX). We have also been learning about partitioning so that we can add and subtract mentally.

We have been creating leaflets for a parish church or a hospital chaplaincy informing people about what the miracles of Jesus teach, bringing all of our fantastic learning together for this unit! *By Illya and Noah*





Year 2's fantastic collage of the Wolf and the Seven Kids story




We are celebrating black history by learning about the lives of incredible black people.


