- If you cannot do one of the questions, move on to the next question and come back to it at the end
- When you have finished your paper, read through each question again carefully, check your method and your answer. Ask yourself, 'Have I done everything the question has asked me to do?'
- And finally, TRY YOUR BEST! 'Good, better, best. Never let it rest. Until your good is better and your better is best.' St Jerome *By Bilguun and Hussein*




