

## Year 5's Blog

In English, we have been learning about an extract from the Jungle Book. The main characters are: Mowgli, Baloo, Bagheera, Sheer khan and Father Wolf. We learnt that classic fiction is recognised as

being the highest quality and outstanding of its kind, the jungle book is a classic fiction. We discussed if it was for young readers or not, we also looked if the dialogue was old fashioned; for example, thou, ye and goest. We also have been doing reading wheel and we were looking at Jesus in The Garden of Gethsemane.

In Maths, we have been looking at decimals and we were given word problems. We then read the questions carefully and figured out which operation to use. After we had to show our working on all questions.

#### Geography

In Geography, we researched about were our food comes from in three different groups. Our group focused on biomes, which are areas of our planet with similar animals and plants for example, in Taiga biomes (which are the largest biomes in the world) it is mostly common to see a conifer which are evergreens. Taiga ecosystems are nowadays threatened by human activities and climate change, animals such as foxes have always been hunted, their warm fur and skin. We explored different sites to find important information about this topic.

In DT, we learned about bread. We looked at different types of breads and their ingredients. We then gathered ingredients for Donia's craving cranberry bread which were yeast, water, flour, herbs, eggs, salt, butter, yogurt and cranberries, for the butter I added a lot more then usual because I wanted a soft texture. 
