Welcome to the Year 4 blog!

This week in science we have been learning about states of matter, it includes solids, liquids and gases. We have done a lot of experiments. For example, Option 1: freeze different types of liquids and see what would happen to it and Option 2 was to leave butter or chocolate in a place that's hot and then put it somewhere cold to see it turn into liquids and then into a solid. We also watched a video of how they made chocolate.

Last week in maths, we were multiplying by 10 and 100 and we also learnt how to divide by 10 and 100.

This week in maths we have started multiplying by 6 and we have also been dividing by 6. We also answered some tricky math problems for example $A=7$ $B=3$ $C=4$ $D=6$. It had to equal to 20.

In English, we read/watched a book called Wolves on the Walls, and we listened to opinions to find out if the children liked it or not. One person said that the characters look like wooden dolls and disliked the illustrations.

In R.E, we are learning about Hinduism. We learnt that the Bhagavad Gita is the Hinduism's holy book and we also had to watch a video about a boy called Svetaketu.








