

Year 5's Blog

We learnt about the worldwide Anglican Communion in RE. Furthermore, we also discussed how many Anglicans there are in the whole world. Did you know that there are over 85 million Anglicans around the world, and 17.5 million are found in Nigeria.

Justin Welby is the spiritual leader of the Anglican Communion; he is titled the Archbishop of Canterbury. Justin became a Christian in 1975 after praying a simple prayer: 'Lord Jesus, come into my life.' Following this, his friend gifted him with a Bible, and in its pages he wrote the powerful words from John 15:16, saying: 'You did not choose me, but I chose you and appointed you so that you might go and bear fruit—fruit that will last—and so that whatever you ask in my name the Father will give you.'

In DT, we investigated different types of bread, such as: baguettes, hot cross buns, croissants and ciabatta. We sketched and annotated them. We baked deliciouslooking and tasting soda bread. There are three component parts of a wheat grain: the germ, endosperm and the bran (outer shell). White flour is not as nutritious as other flours because the germ (the nutrient powerhouse) and the fibrous bran is removed, giving it a finer texture.

Finally, to finish our science unit, we had a revision session where we learnt words such as: soluble, insoluble, solution, mixture and dissolve. *By all of Y5 (shared write)*

Year 4's Blog







Balloon bursting


