Year 6's Blog

In English we have been learning about famous speeches from people like Martin Luther King, King George VI and President John F. Kennedy. We've also been annotating their speeches with language features and text structure which includes quotes from hymns that are from

song books and American slogans. Martin Luther King made an important speech called I have a dream in front of 250,000 people to inspire people to make a change and join the movement of black civil rights and equality. 'I have a dream that one day this nation will rise up and live out the true meaning of its creed.

In Maths we have been doing pie charts to interpret data and solve problems. We also used fractions and percentages to answer questions. We convert data into fractions or percentages and then put it on a pie chart in sections to get the missing numbers. We have also been using protractors and compasses to divide the circle. We must keep a 5cm radius due to the fact that was the length of the protractor. We then had to split it in half. We used a formula, we had a number and then we had to multiply it by 12 to get a 360 degree angle.

In History we looked at WW2 and the history of Britain. In 1939, the Nazi party invaded Poland with the intentions to rule their land. Britain and France joined forces with Poland and began to defend themselves from the invasion and heinous acts of violence, war. This is how Britain joined the war, as a result the Nazi's bombarded the streets of London which was called the Blitz. Which continued for 57 consecutive nights! People hid in tunnels, train stations, sheds, bunkers and basements. Many children were evacuated to country side and some even overseas. This then caused the Great Battle of Britain. When Germany tried to invade Britain by the skies and failed, they later attempted to invade them by sea, Hitler called this Operation Sea Lion (OSL). Britain then retaliated and was able to defend itself from invasion. *By Noah and Illya*

In Maths, we have been learning about fractions and how to convert them into decimals. By dividing the numerator by the

denominator on a fraction. Then we get decimal. For example, 6 divided by 10 is 0.6, and then 6 divided by 100 is 0.06. Then we were in groups and solved problems that our teacher asked us.

In English, we have been learning about poetry. We have been reading many poems about the sea. One of the main poems


we've been learning about is called 'The Sea', by James Reeves. Another thing we've been learning about is poetry terms, for example we have Onomatopia, Metaphors and Stanzas. Our class has also learned in groups how to annotate (examine and take notes) a poem and to understand the techniques used in the poem.

In Maths, we have been learning about how to work out pattern translations. What pattern translations means is when a shape is moving in a certain pattern on a grid using coordinates. This is also called shape translations. For example, to translate an original shape square A to shape A1, you need to move it 4 steps to the left on x direction and 4 steps up in y direction. We also founded new coordinates of translation of translated using directions.

In Geography, We have been learning about the water cycle and how it flows. There are many types of rivers, for example we have an upper-stream river (Young river) mid-stream (Middle aged) and downstream river (Old age). There are four stages in the water cycle are Evaporation, Condensation, Precipitation and Collection. Condensation is when water evaporates and creates water droplets, Precipitation means rainfall.

In Spanish, we have been learning about famous artist's Frida Khalo and Picasso. Picasso was born in 25th October 1881 in Malaga Spain, he died in 8th April 1973 (aged 97). He had 4 children, he made 50,000 pieces of work.

His most expensive of art cost \$9,546 million dollars, his most famous piece of art is called the





Olga in an armchair. We also learnt about Frida Khalo. She was born in 6th July 1907 and died in 13th July 1954. She was born with polio and when she was 18 she survived a bus crash. She painted her injuries and disabilities. She died in her house (age 47)from a heart attack. In our books, we drew portraits emulating both painters work style and researched interesting facts about their lives. *By Aya and Amal*
