Year 6's Blog

In this lovely week we did these subjects. First of all, in RE we are learning about the journey of life and death, in the Christian faith. We have learned lots of milestones in your glamorous lifetime, Such as, being born, getting married, having a child and becoming a grandpa/grandma.

Next, we did Math. In math we did place value and rounding up. In place value we partitioned numbers to their original states, we also rounded numbers to 10, 100 and 1000, the majority of the class also did column based rounding and if you had finished (which no-one did) they would have to do a challenge.

After we did a fun Math lesson, we did Science. In Science we learnt about the human circulatory system —which contained the heart, blood and blood vessels- which is one of the most important human system. We researched about the human circulatory system on the Chrome books with useful websites. There were two parts of this Science project, the first part of this project was to write about the human circulatory system and the beating heart . The second was the human digestive system. We also did diagrams of the human body and labelled the important parts.

Year 4's Blog

Well come to Year 4's awesome blog.

In English we have been learning about fables. Fables are stories that a moral message behind it. Fables also have animals as characters who talk and act as humans do. We read two fables

called the 'Lion and the Mouse' and 'The Boy who cried Wolf'. Then we answered questions about the fables like: what is a genre? What is a moral? We also talked about how to write correctly punctuated dialogue

In Maths we were putting numbers in the right order on a number line to 1,000. Some of the number lines have 10's and 100's division. We then rounded numbers to the nearest 10 up to 1000. For example which multiple of ten is 27 closest to? The answer is 30. We also got a challenge sheet and we had to solve word problems on rounding up to the nearest 10.

In DT we are designing and making our own money containers out of textile. Firstly, we look at other money containers and examined them carefully. We tried to understand that money containers are designed for different purposes and users. Then we designed how we wanted our ones to look like. We sketched from different views. Next week we are going to make our money containers from fabric.

In RE we have been learning about the Bible that has two parts called The Old Testament and The New Testament. The Old Testament was written before the coming of Jesus. It helps us understand who God is. Some of us wrote in our books about the first book in The Old Testament called the Genesis: the story of creation. And others drew a cartoon to explain the story. Before that we watched a video on YouTube about the creation story. *By Lillymae and David*




