## Year 5's Blog

This week in Maths we have been learning to round 6-digit numbers. To do this, we used place value to add and subtract. Also we had to understand what each digit represents in a 6-digit numbers. We were looking at the inverse operation an example is $7 \mathrm{X} 8=56$ and the inverse is $56 \div 8=7$.

In English we have been sorting stories and discussing about the genres. One of the stories was 'Ghosteses'. It was a horror story. Another one was Brainless, it has a fable element which has funny stories. We then identified the genres and wrote what we liked about the short story. We also predicted the different ending.
In RE we read about the woman who touched Jesus's cloak. Then we wrote the story from her perspective a big write on it. The story is about a woman who bled for 12 years and when Jesus came to her town she touched his cloak and was healed. Jesus felt the power and asked who touched him. She said it was her and bowed to his feet.

In Science we are learning about movement of the earth and other planets. We looked at the Stonehenge in relation to the solar system. We researched the difference between Heliocentric and Geocentric. Heliocentric means Sun centred. Geocentric is earth entered.
In DT planned and designed a cam mechanism. First we investigated different types of cam mechanisms. Then we listed the materials we will need for our moving cam. We also wrote instructions for the constriction. Next week will build our cam mechanism. By Dani and Adam

## Year 4's Blog

We had a fantastic week of learning. We hope you will enjoy reading all about it.

In English we continue to learn about Fables. We looked at more Fables like, the Tortoise and the Hare, the City Mouse and Country Mouse. We also read the grasshopper and the ant for homework and some questions to explain the oral of the story. We also retell the fable by writing a paragraph and some people drew cartoons to tell the story.

In Maths we have been rounding up two, three and four digit numbers to tens and hundreds. E.g. 42 is rounded up to 40 and 980 is rounded up to 1000 and 1674 rounds to 1700. Then we added and subtracted two, three and four digit numbers.

In Science we learnt about living things and their habitats. We looked at how classify animals. We grouped animals that are vertebrates and invertebrates. These are animals with back bones and without. In vertebrate group we have humans, polar bears and crocodiles. In invertebrate group we have spiders, octopuses, scorpion and ants. We also looked at amphibians and reptiles in vertebrate group who are both cold blooded animals. The difference is that amphibians have moist skins. Reptiles have scally skins.
In RE we learnt about Genesis: the story of creation. It's found in the Old Testament in the Bible. Some of our classmates drew a comic strip and others wrote a paragraph about the story of how God created the world. We also read the story of Abraham in the same book. From the story we learnt the strong faith he had in God. Have a great weekend! By Cristian and William
