

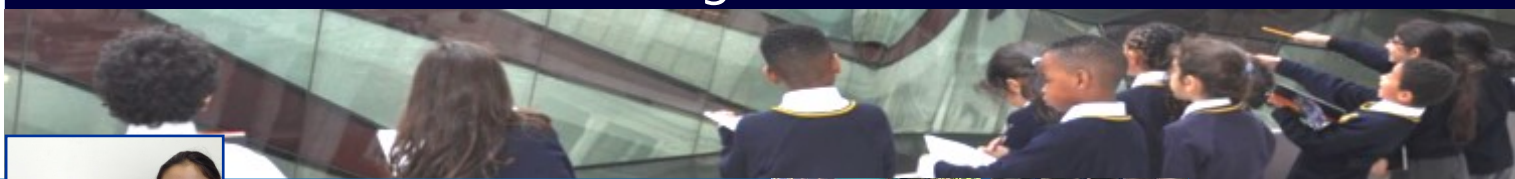

Year 3's super amazing blog!

In Maths we have been learning about perimeters of shapes. We looked at regular and irregular shapes. A perimeter is a measurement of every side of a shape. We used centimetres to measure.

In English we about a book called ‘King of the Sky’. We made a mind map of our homes. Later on this week, we answered questions like ‘When the boy think of home what three things does he think about?’ and ‘What remind him of home?’ The next task we explored the characters and imagine what they might say in the story. Finally we researched how pigeons (the character in the book) were used to correspond messages in the WW2. There were about 250,000 pigeons working in the UK.

In RE we learnt about the seven ‘I am’ statements of Jesus. We looked at ‘I am the bread of life’, I am the light of the world’ and ‘I am the good shepherd’. The good shepherd is a metaphor for protecting, taking care and looking after his disciples and the world in general.

In Art we are learning about decoupage. Decoupage is the art of covering or gluing an object paper and other materials. Last week, we cut pictures about decoupage and wrote about why we chose them. I chose a guitar, chair, a globe and a box. *By Filippo and Ashley*

Year 4’s Blog

Welcome to our FANTASTIC AND AMAZING blog!

In English we have been learning about how to read poems with expression, pace and volume. Also we identified key features of poems, which are onomatopoeia, rhyming, alliterations and similes. We then chose a poem to perform and gave reason why we chose it. The reason I (Giya) chose, ‘There is No Such Thing as Monsters’ is because it scares some people and is fun to preform it. We finally recommended our poems for other people to read.

In Maths we learn about recognising and describing 2D shapes. 2D shapes are flat and cannot be picked up. There are infinite 2d shapes. To define a 2D shape we count the sides of the shape. E.g. circle has one side and triangle has 3 sides. Then we concentrated on triangles. We found out there are three types of triangles, which are isosceles, equilateral, scalene. Isosceles triangles where the two sides are equal, equilateral a triangle that has the three sides equal and scalene is where none of the sides are equal.

In Geography, we have been learning about sketch maps, but our main topic is Urban and Rural area. To create a sketch map we need colours and key features. It doesn’t have to be detailed. We have all created a sketch map on a place called ‘Baaska Voda Port, Croatia (Croatia)’. You used different colours to identify key places on the sketch map, e.g. Ocean=Blue colouring pencil.

In Art we have been learning about sculptures. We have gotten an iPad and we have researched about some artists. E.g. Augusta Savage, Henry Spencer Moore and Sir Anish Kapoor. Some of us added our own opinions to the artist’s work.

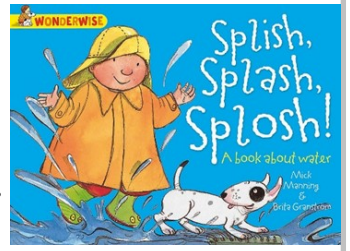
In RE, we have been learning about Liturgy and why it is important to Christians. We have made a list of how we can get along with ourselves, God and others.

This week we have been reading the book.



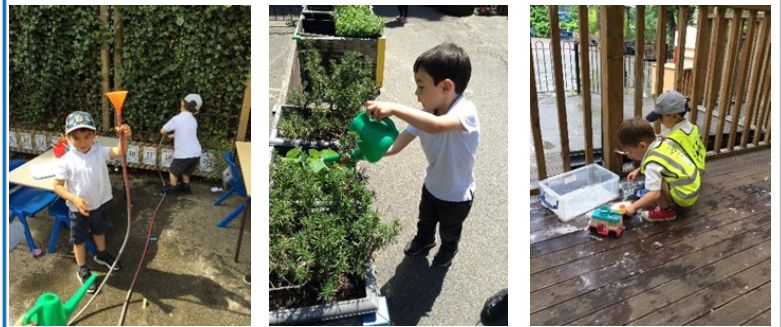
We made umbrellas and talked about where rain comes from.

We have used water to water the plants as it has been so sunny.



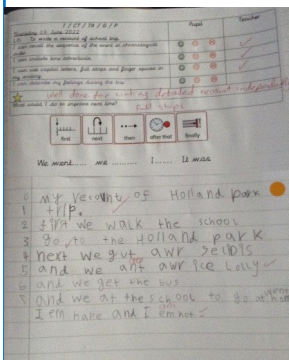
We have been using soapy water to wash our toys.

In Geography we are learning about rivers we did an activity based on rivers. We wrote where in the erosion and deposition occurs. Erosion is when things break down and deposition is when one thing is deposited to another in a river. Then we looked at a model called the Bradshaw model and it shows when it increases and decreases in the river (its GCSE work).

In Maths we were looking at an angle called the straight angle (which is a 180 degrees). Then we looked at reflex angles which is an angle that is more than 180 but less than 360. Then we did an activity based on what we have learnt and completed.

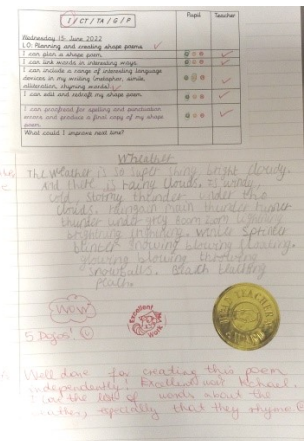

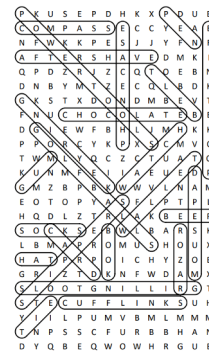
DOUBLE PARKING
