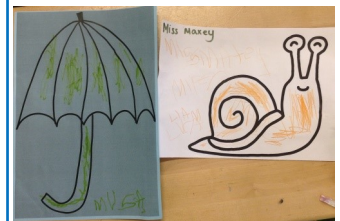
Year 6's Blog

Welcome to our fantastic blog!

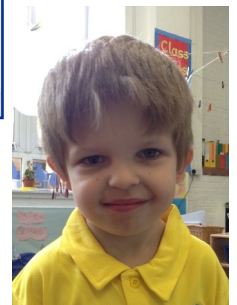
In English we have been learning about how to create a story plan. We created our own characters and explained who they are and why they are doing what they are doing. We used descriptive language to enhance our writing. We did a

big write of the story we planned. We completed and finalized our story. We proofread each other's story. Finally we improved and edited our story.

In Maths we were learning about halves and thirds. We looked at how to recognize them. Half is one of two equal parts of one whole. One third is one part of three equal parts of one whole. We also did some problem solving on fractions, e.g. what fraction of these apples is circled? 6/8 were circled.

In Geography, we wrote a diary entry about a day in the life of children in a rainforest. We imagined to be the child in the rainforest and wrote the diary in sensory language including facts about food homes traditions and rituals. We can hear hammering birds and roaring tigers, monkeys shouting to alert danger. We also listed the skills we need to survive in the forest.

In Art, we made decoupage of plates. We used plastic plates and stuck napkins with different patterns. We used paint to decorate the edges and the inside. Then wrote some facts about our plates and explained our designs. *By Oliver and Eliza*

Welcome to year 4 creative blog!

In English, we have been learning about rhyming poetry. We did a planning poetry grid about colours

for example, what is blue? Blue is a crystal lake flourishing every day. We also used language that sounds good in performance poetry.

In Maths, we have been learning how to draw coordinates on a grid and plot a point on a 2D grid. To draw a grid, the x axis is drawn horizontally and the Y axis is drawn vertically. We used the phrase ‘along the corridor’ and ‘up the stairs’. The right way to read coordinates is to put the X axis first and the Y axis second. We also did a recall mind map about properties of shapes and we did another mind map about position and direction. We even played a game about graphs and coordinates.

In Art we have been sketching famous sculptures from pictures. There were spiders, dolphins, statues of people. We then stuck pictures in our books to copy the sculptures easily. We gave our opinions about the sculptures.

In RE we were learning how important each element of the liturgy are. We also looked at how to build relationships with God, others and yourselves.

In Sports day we went to Holland Park to do our completions. We had six stations as there were six year groups. We played six different games. The hardest were tennis ball balancing challenge and the jumping wedge. It was not too sunny and we had so much fun. After we had lunch we headed back to school. It was terrific. *By Mohamed and*

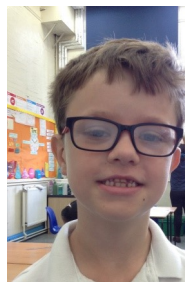

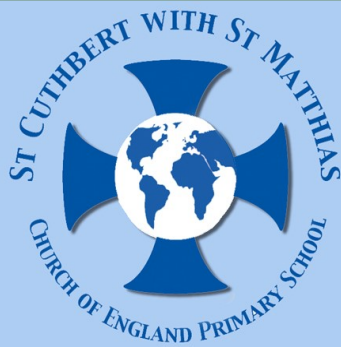

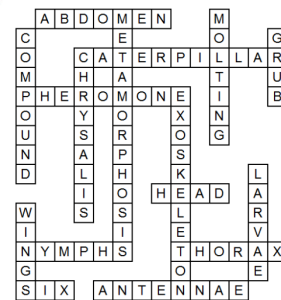
