Welcome to our blog, I hope you had a good half-term.

In English we are learning about journalistic writing. Journalistic writing must have subheadings and titles and is mostly about writing in an active voice. It is mostly in a newspaper report or spoken in an active voice by a reporter, although it is in 3rd person. Sometimes quotes are

needed in journalistic writing, so are adverbial phrases to give a specific date or time.

In Maths we learnt how to convert fractions into decimals, example, 62/500 = 124/1000 = 0.124 because 500 multiplied by 2 = 1000 and 62 multiplied by 2 = 124 so 62/500 multiplied by 2 = 124/1000, 124/1000 also = 0.124 as a decimal. We also learnt how the value make a different in the total, example is 50/100 = 0.5 = 1/2 a skill is to whatever you do to the denominator you do to numerator.5/100 would be 0.05 so it is important to remember the place value of the numbers.

In DT we have been learning about all different types of shoes such as: the Jutti, Geta, Mucklucks and the clogs. These shoes are all from different parts of the world, for example the Jutti's are from northern India and are not sewn together but there hammered together. A couple of days after this we collected all our ideas and started to make our own shoe, but of course we had to have made a brief of our new shoe so we made our brief and then started to create our own shoe!!! Firstly we made a pattern of our foot by tracing around our foot then cutting out the trace of our foot. Then we picked out a design pattern for our shoe and stitched everything together. Finally we cut out a trace of our foot in cardboard then stuffed our pattern with the cardboard cut-out and then our shoe was made.

In Geography we learnt about ancient civilizations. One of the main ones is the Shang Dynasty which was in North China Plain and was built in 1300 B.C. People back then carved words in caves. *By Aya and Leah*

Hello and welcome back to school after a week-long break!

In English this week, we were looking at the Jungle Book by Rudyard Kipling. We were answering questions about our chosen characters. E.g. which character stood out to you the most? And what makes the speech in the book different compared to text? On Thursday, we were looking at our chosen character trait's and wrote it down in a mind map like style. Our characters were: Shere khan, Tabaqui, Mother Wolf, Baloo, Father Wolf, Bagheera and Mowgli. E.g. Bagheera is a clever, affectionate towards Mowgli and sometimes sneaky.

In Maths we were looking at coordinates and we used some phrases to help us remember how to use them e.g. 'Learn to walk before you learn to fly and along the corridor and up the stairs', to remind us to look at the bottom number first on the X and Y axis. On Thursday, we were looking at multiplying a four digit number by a one digit number.

In RE, we started a new topic based on 'What happens in churches during Lent and Easter', we found out the meanings of some of our key vocabulary e.g. Ash Wednesday – On Ash Wednesday people burn palm leaves into ash to symbolise death and repentance.

In Art, we have been looking at 'Illuminated art design'. Illuminated means to light up and it comes from the Latin word 'illuminare'. Illuminated art drawings are only used in the first letter of the first word in a story book or a holy book.
