In Maths We have been learning about partitioning to 1000. We also did word problem solving. We solved problems that was in base 10 then we answered in numerals and words. We also partitioned whole models, which are circles that are connected to other circles where we

Year 5's Blog

Welcome to our very exiting blog, which we hope you will enjoy!

In English we learnt about adverbials. An adverbial is a phrase describing a verb and it shows how, when and where. For example five shepherds fall asleep near a field. The adverbial here is near a field because it shows you where it is. There are two types of adverbials: fronted adverbials and adverbials in the middle of the sentence.

In Maths we learnt about conversion. We looked at conversion between metre into kilometres, millilitre into litre and miles and kilometres. Then we drew a graph and we connected intermediate points like: 5 miles equals to 8 kilometres. We also learnt about 24 hour clock and we used chalk to draw a clock outside and we discovered the difference between the 12 hour clock and the 24 hour clock the 12 hour clock is divided into 2 segments whereas the 24 hour clock is a full rotation.

In Science we used the earth's rotation to explain day and night and the apparent movement of the sun across the sky. We went outside to measure our shadow in the ks1 playground and we measured it at 12:02. Our hypotheses was that the higher the sun was in the sky the shorter the shadow is. The closer the sun gets to the ground, the shadow gets the longer.

In DT we are making moving toys. We first made a prototype of a cam mechanism out of cardboard. We made ours individually and one of ours even worked! We made different cams like the pear cam, the snail cam, the lip cam and the circle cam. The snail cam was easy to make because it was just the shape of a snail and all it does is stay still and drops in a linear motion.

A few of us went on to attend a 2 hour Latin class which was about Classics. We looked at Roman culture, language and lifestyle. 
