Year 5's Blog

Welcome to year 5's spectacular blog!

In Maths we have been multiplying a fraction by a whole number. We found out how to multiply fractions by a whole number on a number line. We then learnt how to divide fractions by a whole number and we used intervals to help us multiply fractions on a number line. E.g. 2/5 divided by 2=1/5. We had a

worksheet to complete it was about equivalent fractions.

In English we have been redrafting and editing our traditional tales and transforming them into a story and making better sentence starters. my traditional. We also punctuated speech properly e.g. "I'm practising all the time," said Max.

In Science we conducted an experiment to test the absorbency of different types of tissue. We also talked about the word variable. Variable means the subject is to change. Our prediction was that the blue roll was the most absorbent because it was thicker. Method: we decided to fill a measuring cup 25ml, so we filled actually filled it with 50ml and approximately guessed half of it to make it 25 ml. Then we filled 3 trays with water and waited for the tissue to absorb the water. After that we picked up the tissue and squeezed the tissue into the measuring cylinder .The toilet roll absorbed 8ml out of 25ml; blue absorbed 5ml out of 25ml; and the white tissue absorbed 51/2 ml out of 25ml, so the toilet roll won.



This week in English we wrote an extract

about Little Red Riding Hood. We used our story maps to help us write independently. We used powerful verbs and adjectives as well as speech and character description. We continued to write the extract and used correct punctuation in cursive writing. We worked with partners to identify where the speech marks went and we used macaroni pastas as speech marks on our text paper. We then wrote the correct text with speech marks in our books.

In Science we made a recall mind map of living things and their habitats. Humans, trees, insects, animals and flowers are all living things. Habitats are where animals live. We continue to classified objects and materials as solids, liquids and gas. We also made another mind map of states of matter. Examples of solids are, sand, plastic and ice cream. 




