Welcome to our exciting blog.

In English we have been reading and discussing texts that uses persuasive language in speeches. We labelled features of the text, such as conjunctions to explain, rhetorical questions and third person. We then wrote a persua-

sive letter to loggers to stop the cutting of trees down. We pointed out that cutting trees affects animals, humans and even plants. We used powerful verbs and adjectives. And included strong language to get our points across.

In Maths we been learning about decimals. A decimal goes between whole numbers. We get decimals when we divide an odd number by even number. E.g. 11/2=5.5. We then looked at tenth and

hundredth. We learnt that 10 hundredth are equivalent 1 tenth.10/100=1/10 because when we divide both by 10/100, we 1/10.

In Art we copied a painting of Paul Cezanne's artwork. We had the option of a skull drawing or flowers in a vase. After that we did a still life drawing with colourful chalks in KS1 playground. We drew a bowl of fruits, flowers in a vase and books on the ground.

In History we've been learning about Ancient Greece.

Firstly we drew a timeline to understand what daily life in Ancient Greece was like. After that we took a picture of the order of the events. E.g. 776BC the year of the first Olympic games. We then compared the lives of the ancient Greeks with our lives today. The simi-

larities are; we go to school and get taught to read and write by a teacher



and we both wear vibrant bright coloured clothes. The differences are in ancient Greece only boys were allowed to go to school and train to fight for the army while still at school at an early age.

In RE we have been writing about what we did on our trip to the church on St Cuthbert's day. Last Friday we went to St Cuthbert's church to see Holy Communion and we prayed and sang. We ate holy bread and the adults drank wine. Fr Paul was wearing a cassock and a gown.




