A unit fraction is when the numerator is one, e.g., <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>, 1/3 and <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>. A non- unit fractions when the numerator is higher than one, e.g., 2/3, 4/6 and 6/9.

In music we are learning about folk music from all over the world. First we looked at an instrument from Lebanon called the Oud. It's a string instrument related to the European Oud. We also learn about a Chinese string instrument similar to a harp called Guzheng. By Michael and Sohban


