In Maths this week we have been learning about algebra, on Monday we explored algebraic expressions. We then looked at all the operations, when you divide X the lines don't cross and when you add a number to 2x it becomes 2x+

whatever you added this is called an expression. If x was 4 2x + 3 you would do 2 multiply x + 3 this is called an equation. We also looked at one-step and two-step formulas. One step is when you solve an equation with one operation and two step is when you solve an equation with two operations

In English we are learning about journalistic writing and newspaper reports. We are currently writing about sky diving incidents and catastrophes. We wrote about a skydiver that crashed in the middle of a spring fair located in the park. We then are going to write about two little kids that save or help the skydiver from his/her fall. We have to include eye witness statements (interrupted, second, first and indirect). The kid's names are Smudge and Charlie, who are characters from Anthony Browne's 'Voices in the Park'.

In RE we did a reflection on our lesson about a tax collector & Jesus' teachings on forgiveness. This lesson we talked about the Stations of the Cross and how important they were. We also discussed the perspective of the people that witnessed the stations. There were many witnesses to the crucifixion; Mary Magdalene, His mother Mary and Simon of Cyrene to name a few. We also discussed how they felt and what each image represented. We said emotions like sad, heartbroken and miserable and key words such as hope, salvation and forgiveness. This is in preparation for a Big Write next week where we will 'interview' the characters.

In History and Geography we learnt about the era of the Shang Dynasty of Ancient China. Firstly, we looked at its religious artefacts, some of the artefacts are Ji (a spear), Ding (a Relic made of bronze). We also looked at jobs, currency, Kings, The four classes, trade and religion. The four classes are The Royals, The Military, Artisans & Craftsmen, finally the peasants... they also had farmers but ther were not part of the four classes. They traded silks, jade and bronze ware.



In Art we have been drawing sketches of what we could hear on an audio. The sounds of raging waves, of people screaming for help, with emergency bells and more. We then sketched what we imagined to be happening, and made beautiful pieces of art. Next, we sketched a story titled 'A Ship-

wreck in Stormy Seas' that had lots of ambitious vocabulary and repetition, which our marvellous teacher Ms. Head read to us and we also sketched what she was talking about (e.g. thunder).

In English we prepared a talk

In English we continue to explore traditional tales. This week we wrote a synopsis (a short summary) of a book called When a For-

est Meets the Sea. We looked at the message of the book and how it persuaded the readers to look after the rainforest and the environment. We answered questions to summarise the book. We also made a mind map for persuasive writing. It's a type of writing where the writer tries to convince that their idea the best. Additionally we made our own comic stip. We made up the stories and also drew the characters. We included onomatopoeic words, which are word that sound the same as the actions. E.g. Bam, pop, boom, smash, and splash.

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
