We looked at some questions and answered them in our books. E.g. which poem was more optimistic in your opinion? Which one was more challenging to understand?

In Maths, we were learning how to do the inverse operation to double check our original answers. An example, we can do 210/5 which is 42 and to double check you multiply 5x42=210. Our challenge was true or false for different word problems.

In RE we started a new topic about how Christians would advertise Christmas to show what it means to them. Here are some secular examples: Santa Claus, chocolates, decorations and music. Christians believe St Nicholas gave presents to children and adults who were persecuted for their religion, a fun fact is that Jesus wasn't born on the first day of Christmas (25 of December). In addition, Christmas ends on 4th January because the three wise men came to visit Jesus on that day.

In History, we started a new topic about WWII. We learnt about different leaders like Adolf Hitler, Mussolini, Winston Churchill and Neville Chamberlain. But Adolf Hitler was the most deadly of them all. A fact about him is that he broke a Munich agreement with other leaders to only invade a part of Czechoslovakia but three days later he invaded the whole of Czechoslovakia. Then Britain, France and Poland made a pact to team up against Hitler. On the 3rd of September Hitler declared war against Britain which started WWII. *By Dani and Mouemin*


