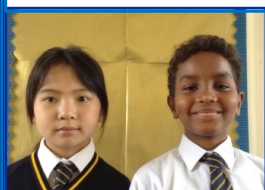
In Maths we were looking at numbers up to 10,000. Then we were doing some questions using the place value chart.

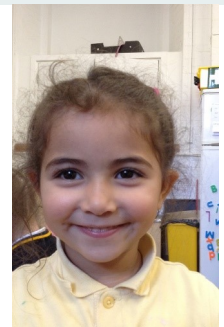

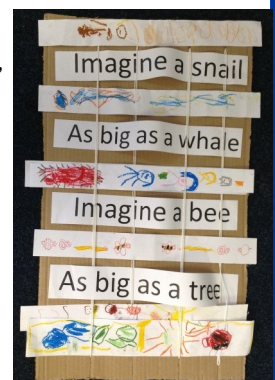

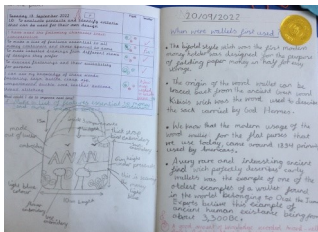
## Year 4's Blog

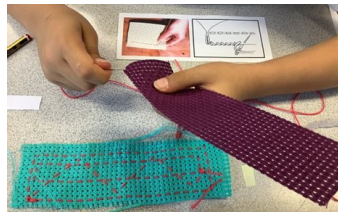


## HEADTEACHER'S LETTER

Dear St Cuthbert children and parents,

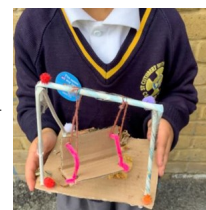
How amazing to have bright sunshine for our trip to the church yesterday and thank you to the families who joined our Harvest Celebration!

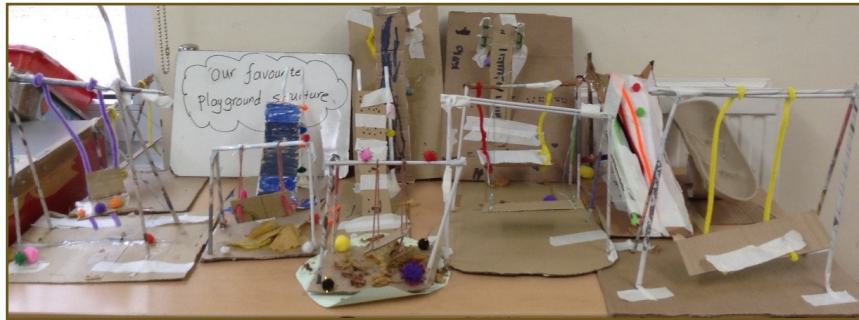
## Second hand Uniform Sale

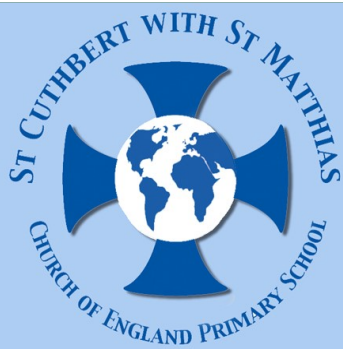

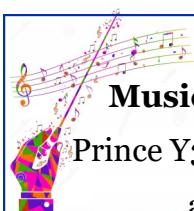
