In English we have been learning about prefixes. They are

groups of letters that have words added in front of them. It changes the meaning of the root word. We were given prefixes like un, auto, anti, trans and over. We then wrote our sentences with the root words we were given. E.g. afraid to unafraid. "I was unafraid to hit the rubber with a frying pan." We also sorted words with prefix from the ones with out.

In Maths we are learning how to multiply 3 digit numbers with 1 digit number. We used the column method to solve the questions as well as word questions. We also did reasoning and problem solving and we used the same method. E.g. to work out How many pages Teddy and his mum read, when mum read 4 times as many as Teddy did. Which were 814. We multiplied the 814x4= 3256 and subtracted 814. We got 2442.

In Science we wrote a short story to describe the water cycle. We can chose between a big write and a poem. We used scientific vocabulary in our writing. We wrote our poem or big write in the first person and from a point of view of a little drop let. A snippet of Michael's big write; "Water evaporates and makes rivers and oceans. Then the vapour goes up to the sky and cools. Condensation happens to make clouds." We drew the water cycle in our books.

In DT we are learning about pop ups. Miss Putterill showed us different types of pop ups. There were for different occasions such as mother's day, valentine day and some creatures. We first made slide mechanism pop up by following a clear instruction. We then decorated it however we waned. We then made the fish which had a lot more step to complete. *By Michael and Sobhan*

In conclusion hope this presentation has changed your opinion about violent video games I would also like to add that we must live in the real world and not the virtual world


