Welcome to our extraordinary blog!

In English we analysed non-chronological reports. The report we were looking at was about Pompidou Centre, which is a building that has its inside on the outside such as the pipes, staircases, the hallways and the plumbing. It was built in Paris in 1971 and was very controversial for being inside out. Then we answered different questions in our books. For example what is the building used for. It’s used as a modern art museum and is the largest in Europe.

In Maths we are doing perimeter of a rectangle. We did properties of a rectangle. For example all sides of a rectangle are straight and the rectangle is symmetrical. Did you know that a rectangle shape is a shape that has straight sides and right angles?

In RE we looked at what the phrase ‘the prince of peace’ means. We discovered that the prince of peace is Jesus. Because in his teachings Jesus spoke about how to always be peaceful and work for world peace.

In Art we explored the design of two designers called Enid Marx and William Kilburn. They were both famous textile designers. Enid Marx, who was the cousin of Carl Marx, designed the London underground seats. William Kilburn was an Irish illustrator who has very distinctive style involving flowers. We then designed our own patterns. Some of us copied their style and some created their own.

Year 4 and year 3 went to a home farm. When we got there it was very smelly and stinky. We saw so many cows and pigs. Did you know that they have 190 big cows and 38 baby cows. We found some flints and other pretty cool rocks. We pet the baby cows and got to feed the big cows. We found a worm that was 30cm. it was a 1 hour and 20 min drive on a mini coach. We tried different types of cheese. 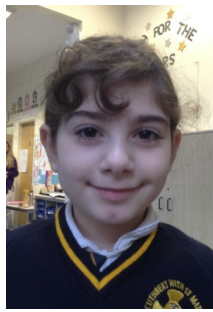

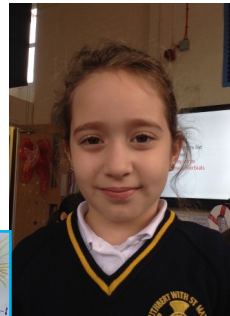

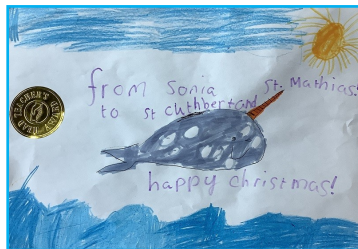
