Year 4's Blog Welcome to our magical blog!

In English we wrote our own stories for Story Telling Week. It was a task given by Miss Putt-

erill. Our story can be a mixture of real and non-real. Firstly we created story maps of the story we wanted to tell. On the map we put time, subject and main events. Then we made our amazing colourful story bags. In the bags we included objects and cards with writings from our stories. My (Mekehseb's) story is about an ice-cream cone trying to poke me. In my bag I had drawings of the ice cream, cup of coffee and some donuts. Mine (Gabi's) story is about my weekend. I went to the gorgeous grassy green park. Then on the way to my piano lesson I saw a big fat elephant walking on the road crashing the cars here and there. In my bag I put a mini piano, a hair band, a hair clip and a big colourful drawing of an elephant. Finally we edited our story to make it perfect.

In Maths we are learning about efficient multiplication. It's exploring different methods to solve metal multiplication. We tried 4 methods. The first one is partitioning two digit number in to tens and ones to multiply one and two digit numbers. 25x8 = 20x8 + 5x8. The second method is using factor pairs. To calculate the multiplication. Method 3 is with partition with subtraction. E.g. 25x8 = 25x10 - 25x2. The last on included division. E.g. 25x8 = 50x8/2.

In RE we looked at why Hindus go on pilgrimage. We matched spiritual words to their meanings. E.g. Prashad is food or flowers offered to God to be blessed. Mandir a place where Hindus pray. Then we answered 5 questions about a picture of people washing in the river of Gangish. Questions such as where do you think they are?, Describe how the people are feeling? We answered they are in the river Gangash and they are feeling grateful, blessed and like a new person.

In Science we investigated how quickly water evaporates from different sized containers. On Tuesday we put 50ml in four different sized containers next to the window. The first bowl evaporated all the water

in the bowl, Then the second bowl was 29ml, the third bowl had 15ml and the final container hadn't changed. We found out that the bigger the container the more water




