Year 4's Blog

Welcome to our marvellous blog!

In Maths we have continued to learn about fractions. We focused on equivalent fractions. They are fractions that are equal to another type of fractions. E.g. $1/3 \approx 2/6$.

We also looked at mixed fractions. Which are fractions that are greater than whole 1. We usually see them on number line. For example on a number line we 2 $\frac{1}{4}$, 2 $\frac{3}{4}$, 2 $\frac{3}{4}$, 2 $\frac{3}{4}$, 2 $\frac{4}{\approx}3$. We answered questions mixed numbers, counting in fifths and sixths, as well as completing a number line with fractions.

In Science we learnt about conductors and insulators. Conductors are materials that allow electricity to flow through them, e.g. metal, iron, steel, and silver, aluminium, and graphite. Insulators do the opposite and do not allow electricity to flow through them. Some example of insulators are glass cups, candles, rubbers, plastic things. We also looked at metals that are good conductors such as copper, aluminium, and gold.

In RE we continue to learn about what it means to be born in to a Hindu family. When babies are born parent draw the Aum symbol on their tongue. We also learnt about that Hindu boys shave their head at young age, they leave a patch of hair which is called Upanayana. They believe that it will cleanse their past karma. They also believe that get another chance to achieve your goal in another life and another life form. We drew a picture of ourselves as a Hindu person and labelled the different features.

In Art we are working on paintings in a style of window art, of our selves holding something that is important to us. We are using acrylic and poska pens. 


