Year 4's Blog

Welcome to our new and first blog of Year 4!

In English we learnt about fables. Fables are short stories and often have talking animals and has a moral lesson. We read a fable called Town Mouse and Country Mouse. It's one of the most popular fables that Aesop wrote. He also wrote the Fox and the Grape and The Hare and the Tortoise. After we read the story we answered some questions. Soon we are going to do a fabulous big write.

In Maths we just started learning about place value, which is the numerical value that a digit has by virtue of its position in a number. We used beads, the hundred squares and blocks to explore the place values of numbers.

In Science we have been learning about living things and their habitats. We found out what the 7 characteristics of the living things are. They are movement, reproduction, sensitivity, nutrition, excretion, respiration and growth and breathing. We then matched these words with their definitions in our books. Some of the facts learnt are, that animals usually move their whole body from one place to another, whereas plants move towards the light. Plant roots grow down into the soil towards water. We also learnt Animals have babies, but plants produce seeds to reproduce.

In RE we learnt about the people of God. These are the people we know from the Bible. We wrote down Jesus, Mary, Mary Magdeline, Abraham, Moses, Paul, Peter, Luke, Judas and John the Baptist. We watched a clip about Abraham's strong faith on God. He demonstrated that by doing whatever God asks of him. We then wrote key vocabulary so we can use them in our writings.

In DT we have been planning our money bags. We will then design and choose a superb colour and then we will make our money bags with leather, string and we will sew it together. Next we will test if they work. *By Ashely and Yusuf*




An amazing poster from Year 4 on how to save the planet from climate change devastations.








