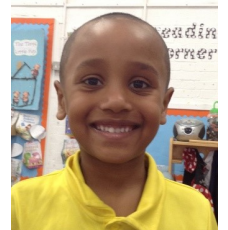

Year 4's Blog

Welcome to our fantastic blog!

In English we were recapping the Hare and the Tortoise story. We put the right punctuation on the dialogues. We also used powerful adjectives to make dialogue more exciting. We used words like shouted, replied, laughed, boasted and blasted instead of boring words like said. E.g. "Why don't we have a race?" suggested the Tortoise.

In Maths we are rounding up to the nearest 100. We used the 10s column to determine which way to go. We also did representing numbers in numerals and words. E.g. XXIX is 29 which we rounded up to 0. We then did some word and table problems of rounding up to the nearest hundred.

In Science we are exploring the five kingdoms of living things. They are plants, animals, fungi, protest and monera. We then sorted different living things into; is it a mammal?, does it have legs?, does it have a backbone? , does it live in water?, is it a crustacean? We also answered some questions on different skeletons. Some livings have an exoskeletons, which are skeletons on the outer body. Some examples, calms, ticks, spiders, scorpions and mites. We found out some facts about arachnids. Did you know they work together and like to go fishing. And ants can be spiders in disguise.

In RE we are learning about how Moses followed God's calling for his life. We found out that Moses's mum put baby Moses in a basket and let him float away on the river Nile. At the time Egyptians killed new born baby boys from the Israelite families, where they were enslaved. God called Moses to save his people from slavery in Egypt. We also learnt about what a vocation is. It's a dedication of life to serve God. E.g. a priest, a monk. *By Anand and Gabriel*

Now, just before we head into our weekend, let's hear about the week from two of our Y2 pupils....

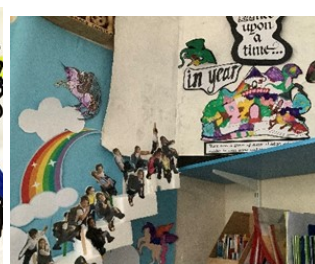
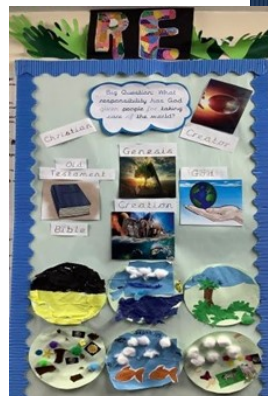

Year 6's Blog

Welcome to Year 6s fantastic blog!

In English we have been reading a book named War Horse by Michael Morpurgo. We then concentrated on an extract and evaluated the language impact. We answered questions from the book. Perspective questions on how Joey the horse felt after he got separated from his mother in the auction ring. How did Joey find out Captain Nicholls was no longer with him. We then picked out key events in a narrative and rewrote a scene changing viewpoints of the narrative. Finally we wrote a narrative in the perspective of a German soldier. We wrote, "Today is my first battle. I hope this will only be a skirmish; I really want to make it home..."

In maths we continue to learn about place values of each digit in a number. We also looked at portioning numbers up to ten million, which is a seven digit number. We then completed a task where we described and wrote digital numbers in words. EG: 9,060,050 is nine million sixty thousand and fifty is a seven digit number.

In Science we are learning about the circulatory system and the digestive system. The circulatory system pumps blood from the heart to the lungs to transport oxygen. The blood gets circulated more around the body and brings back the de-oxygenated blood back to the heart to get re-oxygenated. The heart pumps about 5 Litres or eight pints of blood. Around 115 thousand times a day continuously.

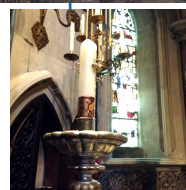
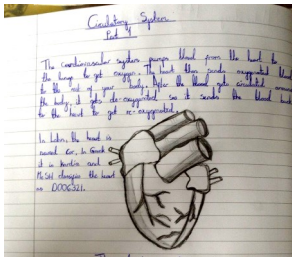
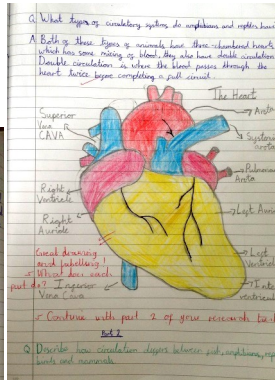
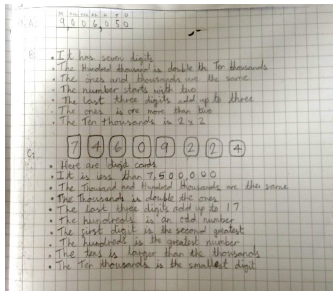
In PE we were playing French and English. The aim of the game is to take a ball and hit it to take a player out. You have to hit the player on the legs. It's a game like dodgeball, but there are two teams, and three dividing lines. Put an equal amount of the objects behind both baselines. Each team needs to aim to steal as many of the objects as possible, without getting caught.

To steal an object the player must successfully make it to the other team's baseline without being tagged. Once they are there they can steal 1 object and release 1 captive team-mate (if there are any).

If the player is tagged while on the other teams half of the playing field, they are caught and must wait at the oppositions baseline until they are rescued.

Yesterday on our religious trip to St Cuthbert Church we were greeted by father James and he led us to the baptismal font. The baptismal font is where babies or adults get baptized. The water in the font contains salt and oil which the bishop blesses and makes. Rite of passage is a ceremony or ritual performed when entering a group. We also learnt that after you get baptized they make a cross on your head with the Chrism oil.

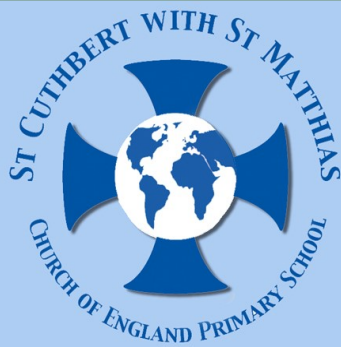


Year 2 children went around the school on a hunt for vowels. Looks like they found a few!

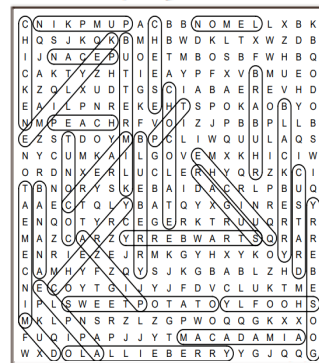
