Welcome to Year 6's marvellous blog!

In Science we learnt about classification keys. They are scientific words we use to categorise living things into groups. Our main focus was to identify similarities and differences between living things. We made a classification key about sweets creating scientific names such as: Smarticus sweeticus (smarties), fruticose (gummy fruits) etc. We even made one about birds such as: yellow hammer, great tit and blackbird etc.

In RE we learnt about the Apostles creed and how it helped the Christian message survive for around 2000 years. What is the Apostles' creed? The Apostles' creed is a prayer that outlines the beliefs of the Christian faith. After that we discussed why translation is important in helping the Christian message survive. We watched a video about a girl named Mary Jones. Mary Jones saved up for 6 years so she could afford a Bible in her language (Welsh). We watched a video of a girl maned Kim Sang Hwa (probably a fake name), who practised Christianity and is forced to hide it so she won't be persecuted or executed. However there are still 200,000-400,000 Christians living in North Korea, most of them are in labour camps because of their faith. We then answered question about how Christians in the UK can support fellow Christians around the world.

Year 5's Blog

Welcome to Year 5's wonderful blog!

This week in Maths we were learning how to calculate angles on a straight line. An angle is a corner of a shape. An example of an angle is a right angle or an acute or obtuse. Any angle that's less than 90 degrees is an acute angle and any angle which is more than 90 degrees, but less than 180 degrees is called an obtuse an-

gle, and a reflex angle is an angle that's bigger than 180 degrees but smaller than 360 degrees. We also learnt about how to add two angles together to make a full turn [360 degrees]. E.g. $230^{\circ} + 130^{\circ} = 360^{\circ}$.

In ENGLISH we were comparing the similarities and differences between two games called Pacman and Space invaders as a contrast presentation. An example of a similarity is that Pacman and Space invaders were both made in the 20th century and one difference is that in Pacman you need to go up and down to avoid the enemy and in Space invaders you need to go side to side to avoid the enemy.

In RE we learnt how and why the Sikh Khalsa were formed. They were volunteers that came forward to die for their religion and ended up forming a new community. We also wrote how our beliefs are similar to Sikh beliefs. We share compassion to animals and determination to stand up for what we believe.

In DT we evaluated our musical instruments. We talked about how our planning sequence helped us make our instruments. We split in to two groups and discussed about the materials we used and how we made it. We also talked about what improvements can be made and what was good about our instrument. By Abdul and Andy


