Welcome to our dazzling blog!

In English we started a new topic about poetry. We read and discussed a poem called The Garden Year. Its about the months of the year. We annotated and identified adjectives, rhyming words, personification, alliteration, and reputation. We

then prepared our own poems with our partners.

In Maths we explored the tenth column on the value charts. We were given a number to figure out how to place it on the value chart. E.g. 42= 4 tens and 2 ones. We also added fractions using a number line. We put the whole numbers on the top and the decimals at the bottom of the number line.

Welcome to Year 5's spectacular blog!

In English we have been learning about imagery such as personification, similes, and metaphors. We have been looking at poems on shipwrecks and using our knowledge, vocabulary and adjectives to label a scene of our choice and write expanded noun phrases such as: The lonely, abandoned oxidised bow of the ship stuck half-way out of the aquamarine shallows. And we have been learning how to describe with evocative imagery, which allows the reader to really feel like they're in the story with the characters. We watched 3 videos, 2 of which were about shipwrecks on Endurance and one was about sea creatures of the deep.

In Math we have been looking at our math arithmetic tests and looking over what could have be done better, most specifically word problems. And the answers in green pen and we went through most of the problems. We were focusing on word problems this week and we also learnt about reflections. On Monday we looked at shape's reflection and we did some exercises on that particular topic.

In Art we have been doing still life in a style of 2 different Artists. We looked at drawing plants that Miss Putterill kindly let us borrow and we drew them in our style and then their style, we would then have to describe the Tone, Composition and Colours. Geography we have been learning about how rivers and waterfalls form. We learnt about erosion and deposition. Erosion is when rocks hit other rocks and chip parts off, this process is called erosion. 




