HEADTEACHER'S LETTER

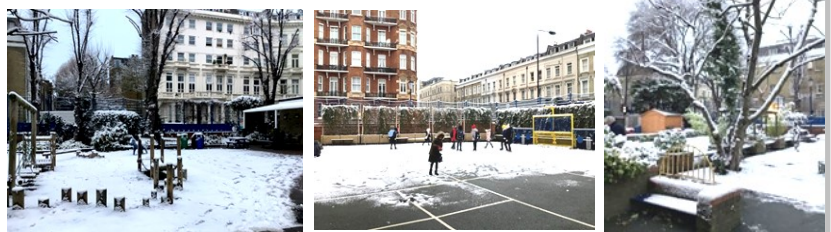
Dear St Cuthbert children and parents,

Christmas meal that is taking place on the 24th December. I am sure your thoughtful messages will bring so much joy to the guests.

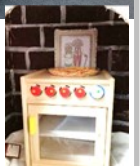


Finally, we wish our families a restful and safe holiday. And to our Christian families, we additionally wish you a blessed Christmas.

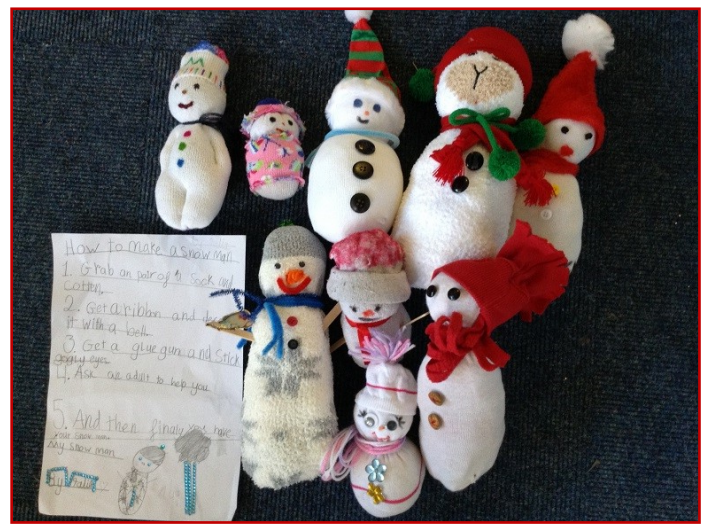

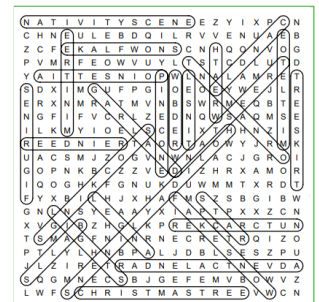
