This week in English, we have been working on "narrative writing" and our class made a story mountain about our own story we made. A narrative writing must have an opening, a build-up, a problem, a resolution and an ending. We created a made up story of our own; my story was about a mouse, who's gotten his home destroyed so he makes a long journey to somewhere else. After that, we edited our paragraphs and made them better.

#### RE

During this week in RE we have been learning about Adam and Eve and the Creation story. We also learnt about rules and how they play a big role around the world such as laws. We learnt that for every bad decision we make there is a consequence and rules are there for a reason.

#### Science

In Science, we made a story mountain about our own story just like in English and then we wrote a story about a scientist trying to invent or create a major item for the world like a cure or a vehicle etc. Later, our class rewrote and edited our writing's paragraphs.

#### DT

This week in DT, our class worked on fairgrounds and circuits; we worked in groups of 3-4 to design our ride and how it would work. My group designed a "chainfair swing" by using a switch, wires, a battery, a motor, string and cardboard. We learnt 3 new words: component, circuit and microprocessor. Component means different parts used in a circuit (motor, bulb, buzzer, switch, wire and battery). Circuit means a combination of components. Microprocessor is used to programme and control how an electrical system would work.

#### Art


In Art, we have been learning about graphic designs and some graphic designers such as Andy Warhol, William Morris and Sarah Miller. After that, we learnt 4 words: form,




**Selina Y1** "In Mental Maths we are learning about one more. We used a number line to find out the answer. We made one jump in the line to add one."

### Head Teacher's Letter


Dear St Cuthbert children and parents,

## Year 4's Blog

Welcome to our wonderful Year 4's blog!

In English we continue to learn about persuasive writing. We read a two different letters with persuasive writings. One was to Tesco supermarket in Earl's court where we wrote asking for them to help a charity called Dad's House by donating food. The other one was from another school called Spring Primary school. They try to persuade their head teacher to let them not wear school uniform. We used key features like facts and rhetorical questions, frontal adverbials and powerful objections.

In Maths we learnt to collect and represent data. We used bar charts. Pictograms, tally charts. We also did line graphs. We drew a line graph to represent a growing plant every two days. We also did another line graph about the distance a cyclist travels on a bike.

In Art we started a new topic about sculptures. We also looked at works of famous artists and researched their life history. We then wrote important facts about Augusta Savage, Henry Spencer Moore, and Sir Anish Kapoor.

In Geography we learn about human geography and physical geography. Human geography is an activity or buildings that are made by the humans such as agriculture, houses, settlements global warming fishing. Physical geography is made by nature activates, such as rainforest, earth quakes, weather, and rivers. We then wrote a text about land use, which humans use as an area for a specific purpose. In RE, we have been learning about why it is important for a Muslim to repeat Shahada. We explored the importance of the Shahada; it is a special statement that allows people to convert people to Muslim faith. In Geography, we were learning where our local river, the river Thames comes from and goes to. After that, we got chrome books and went on google maps to find the source and the mouth of the river.
