Welcome to Year 6's phenomenal blog. ☺

In Maths, we started a new topic about Fractions. Firstly we made a mind map (like we always do at the beginning of every new topic) and included key words like: mixed f, numerator, denominator, improper f, equivalent f, times tables, common factors, whole factors, unit, percentages, etc. We used a fraction wall to simplify some fractions. For example, 35/40 would be 7/8. We also used factors to simplify f. (f = fractions)

In English, we wrote a story about being a refugee and moving into a camp. We used some information from a different lesson to add some more detail. We had to add some emotion and a few other techniques. My character was named Muna and she was a refugee from Serbia. She had about 10 minutes to pack up her stuff and leave her house. She didn't get to say any goodbye to no one at all, not even her grandmother. We have been, recently, learning about homophones. Homophones are a group of words that have the same sounds but different spellings and meanings. We used the homophones in sentences and had some turns of saying them.

In Geography, we have been learning about biomes. Biomes are areas of the planet with similar climates, landscapes, animals and plants. We learnt about the different biomes which are: Tundra, Taiga, Deciduous Forest, Coniferous Forest, Grasslands, Savannah, Desert, and Rainforest. We used an atlas to find different places on the earth —using coordinates. We made posters about the biomes and used the chrome books. Some of included graphs which we got a dojo for. Today we learned about the human impact on earth and also started a poster about Africa's situation with the USA (and especially European countries) dumping second-hand clothes into their beaches. We watched a video about it and took some notes.

In RE we have been planning and writing the nativity story in the point of view of one of the angels attending Jesus's birth. We had to use the rule of 3, amazing adjectives, cliff hangers, metaphors and fronted adverbials. We had 3 lessons with Miss Putterill and today was the final lesson. We had to re draft and re write it in our books so it can be used in the K2 nativity

Choir Trip

On Tuesday, we -year 6, year 5, year 4, year 3 and year 2- went to Peter Jones. We had some Santa/ Christmas hats on and we looked very stylish. We went on a train to Sloane Square and walked to the big shopping centre. A man name Mr Ben, took us to put our coats away and showed us to where we would be singing. 
the damage plastic is doing to our world!


