Welcome to Year 6's spectacular blog! 😳

In English, we are reading a book called 'War Horse'. It's a book about a horse who got separated from his mother when he was sold to a farm where the owner was selling him in an auction ring. A boy named Al-

bert came and named him Joey. A few weeks later with Albert, he unfortunately got sold to the army and had to fight in WW1. In WW1, 8,000,000 horses and mules died while in battle. Over 700,000 horses were bought or taken by force to join the British army.

In Math, we have been learning about numbers up to 10,000,000, and in number lines, we used the integers to our advantage to see how many digits are in each integer like if there is a number line which is from 5,000,000 to 10,000,000 and three integers, how many are there? When you have a number line you should read the last number carefully to get the right answer.

In DT we've been learning about shelters and how to make a miniature shelter using popsicle sticks and natural sticks that Mr Tom kindly got for us. We made our shelter and drew it using some words like triangulation which means it is a triangle frame that supports the structure. We also wrote about other shelters in the wilderness- most of them were covered in moss and dirt. If a shelter is the shape of a square, it can collapse easily unlike a triangular shaped shelter.

In Science, we have been learning about the circulatory system and we researched animals' hearts. I did a penguin's heart {Mehdi} and I {Lymar} did a honey bee's heart. Then on Thursday, we did a task on a sort of comprehension question with a map of the parts of a human heart and we corrected our work with a green pen.

Year 5 's Blog

Welcome to Year 5's eye -catching blog. In English, we discussed

and read short stories.



We then made a mind map about different genres of short stories. There are adventure, horror, humour, comics, anime fairy tales, and fables. We read a few stories from a book called Short. We identified that one of the stories is a fable because it had a moral at the end. The moral was never 'never judge something before you get to know it'. Miss Putterill set us a task to design a 3D Quinoa package. We research facts about Quinoa's nutritional values and flavour characters in English class and we will design it in DT. In Maths, we used the column method to multiply 4 digits with 1-digit numbers. We had a challenge question to round up to the nearest hundred and work out word questions. E.g. 1432 x 4 is rounded up to 4000 x 4. We then explored the relationship between multiplication and division.

In Science, we explored the movements of the Earth and other planets in relation to the Sun in the solar system. We also understood the difference between heliocentric and geocentric. Heliocentric means centred around the sun and geocentric is centred around the Earth. We watched a video about a scientist called Copernicus and Galileo, we learned that before people thought that the Earth was the centre of the universe and that other planets evolved around it.

In Spanish, we are recalling some of the Spanish words we learned last term. We wrote greetings, characters, and feelings. *By Davyd and Yusuf* Dear St Cuthbert children and parents,

There is a Chinese proverb that goes, "Tell me, and I forget. Show me, and I remember. Involve me, and I understand." After all the active learning experiences I have spotted this past week, I am thinking that there must have been a good amount of understanding! Y5 have been navigating in the Hyde Park, Y4 developing their sew-

ing skills, Y1 developing gardening skills, Y3 pupils investigating pneumatic systems, and Y6 creating their own shelter structures. We look

Year 4's Blog Welcome to our amazing blog! In English, we continue to write a diary entry of the fable

about the Hare and the Tortoise. We wrote using punctuation to denote speech and by adding speech marks to texts. We also created conversations between characters. We used verbs such as asked, said, shouted, and replied.

In Maths, we have been rounding up 2, 3, 4, and 5-digit numbers to the nearest 10. Next, we learnt to partition numbers in different ways. E.g. 12= 1+11, 2+10, 3+9, 4+8, 5+7, & 6+6.

In RE we looked at the difference between a vocation and a job. We gave examples of vocations which are priest, doctor, and nurse. A job is shopkeeper, builder policeman/woman. We then learnt about Moses following God's call, which was given to him through the Burning Bush. Finally, we made a map with questions for religious leaders. And shared our questions with the class. My (Lyla) question was why did you sign up to become a Nun? My (Alfred) question was, who inspired you to become a monk?

In Science, we made a mind map to explore different habitats of living things. We then tried to classify and group different living things into categories. We concentrated on animals with legs. And carried on to identify animals with wings or shells. *By Alfred and Lyla*


