

Year 4's Blog

Welcome to Year 4's great blog! In English, we have been learning adverbials in sentences. An

adverbial is a verb that defines the verb or the sentence by expressing time, place, or manner. E.g. in the afternoon, in the school, and quickly. We wrote a paragraph to recount an event using adverbials in different positions. It was a story from a book, a chapter named Snow Chick. Then we looked at possessive sentences. We learnt where to put the apostrophe s. We put the apostrophe before the s, if it's one person and after the s if it's more than two people. E.g. Malak's pen was on the floor. The boys' jackets were blue.

In Math, we are learning about measuring length. We used millimetres, centimetres and kilometres. We designed a poster about metric lengths. We also looked at what we could measure with those units. We then learnt how to convert from one unit to another unit using 10mm = 1 cm, 100cm = 1m, 1000m = 1 km.In History, we have learning about the importance of temples and their architectural features in the ancient Greece. They were homes for the gods and goddesses. We looked the special features of the pillars of the temples. There are three kind of pillars called Doric, Ionic, and Corinthian. We then drew one of pillars we chose. The Corinthian was the most decorated. In RE, we have been learning about Jesus's legacy. We also explored the meanings of salvation, and resurrection. We then wrote what we think is Jesus's legacy. I wrote that Jesus's legacy is healing kindness and all the good things he did for people.

In Art, we continue working on still life painting. We looked at famous paintings by the artist Paul Cezanne. Then we sketched two of his paintings. Finally we painted one of our sketches. *By Sara*

In English, we have been learning about commas and semi-colons. Semi-colons can be used instead of a full stops between two related sentences. Commas can also


 We are going to have an Easter Bonnet 'parade' at St Cuthbert School on Thursday 28th March, 915am.
