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Year 6's Blog

Welcome to Year 6's astonishing blog ☺

In English, we have been learning about instructions. Instructions tell you how or what to do. We wrote our own original instructions for the 'Happy Feet Dance', we either worked in partners or groups of three. We used imperative verbs (command verbs) like place, turn, put, move, lift, etc. We were told to make one very formal text and one for a website – most of us didn't finish the formal text-. Today we were analysing (comparing) different extracts of instructions and explanation texts. We analysed a text about instructions on how to make a cake, one on why skateboarding is so popular, and one that explained 'When We Spin, Why Do We Feel Dizzy?'. The first text was not really clear so we were confused about what it was talking about. The second text used a lot of repetition and was oversimplified and basic. The last one was perfect, it explained the question/title and it used rich vocab and punctuation.

In Maths, we are learning about prime, square, and cube numbers. We first recalled facts about rules of divisibility and we also explored the factors of square and cube numbers. Such as, 'What is the difference between 20 squared and 20 cubed?' Which would be 7600. Prime numbers to 9 are 2, 3, 5, 7 and 11. Square numbers to 16 are, 1, 4, 9, and 16, and cube numbers to 18 are 1, 8, and 27.

In RE, we have been learning about 'How Christians Advertise Christmas'. We found that the main reasons churches advertise Christmas are to share good news, to share the message to those who haven't heard it before, or to have a relationship with Jesus. We answered some questions about how advertising is inclusive and diverse, the answer would be that 'The advertising is inclusive and diverse by making everyone equal.'

In History, we were looking at different roles of women in WW2, and we looked at the history of Lillian Bader, and how she was the first black woman to be in the British Armed Forces. We watched an advert from 1943 advertising women to start working for the land army since most of the men were out of the country fighting in the war. So, there was no one to look after the crops and animals. We also drew our posters about wanting women to contribute to war.

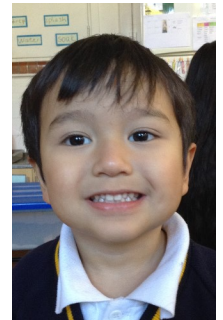
Art/Wallace Collection

In Art, we are learning about self-portraits and art this week we went to the Wallace Collection. We had our tour guide, Luisa –who was also an artist- teach us more techniques on how to draw a self-portrait. We learned about a famous Rembrandt self-portrait, there was an interesting portrait of a prince, whose name was Carlos. Ms Luisa told us that the picture was communicating that there was an heir to the throne. Another portrait we learned about was called 'The Woman with a Fan.' By Velazquez. We then went into a hallway with 3 rooms filled with swords and Chainmail and we had some questions asking us to find stuff with jewelled faces on them. (Lillymae) My favourite part was doing my portrait because we did it in about 15 minutes and I think I did a really good job even though I didn't like how I did my eyes I'm still proud of it.

Y6's Fantastic Debate: On Tuesday, we debated our opinions on whether junk food should be banned or not. We took turns saying some of our points and opinions/facts. 8 people were on the side that it should be banned and 9 people were on the side that it shouldn't be banned. One of my points was that junk food is rich in salt, sugar, and fat, which causes kidney impairment because the kidneys are highly responsive to all three elements. In addition, high sugar content in junk food raises blood sugar levels. An increase in blood sugar levels may raise the number of glucose transporters and regulatory proteins, leading to severe long-term effects kidneys'. *By Aisha and Lillymae ☺*

Welcome to our fantastic blog!

This week in English we learnt

about how to use apostrophes. Use it to show singular and plural possession. For singular we put the apostrophe before the s and for plural, we put the apostrophe after s. We then looked at the purpose of diagrams is to help the reader understand the story. We also wrote some captions for London's famous landmarks, such as the London Eye, Buckingham Palace, and Piccadilly Circus.

In Maths, we counted in multiples of 3, 6, and 9. We then identified patterns in these numbers. We had a task to mark multiples of 3, 6, and 9 on a 100 square. We used different colours and shapes to show the multiples. We noticed a pattern on the square which is a diagonal pattern.

In Art, we explored the works of William Morris who is a British textile artist. We then looked at two of his designs called, 'Peacock and Dragon' and 'African Marigold' and wrote down what we noticed in both designs. It's mainly dark colours and lots of natural shapes like animals, food, and plants. We also chose which one we preferred.

In History, we designed our own Saxon village. The village needs a field, a forest, a river, a fire, livestock, crops, and houses. After we wrote explained our village design. We also did the Saxon timeline. It started in 163 AD when the Romans retracted the Saxons arrived from Germany in 450AD. *By Kate and Raya*

Should junk food be banned?

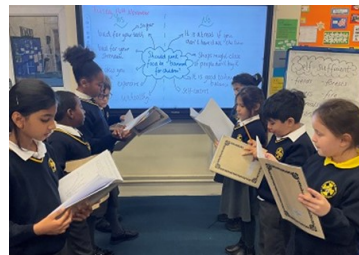

Year 5's Blog

Welcome to Year 5's magnificent blog! In English, this week we have been learning about persuasive texts and expanded noun phrases. How adverts persuade people to buy their products

or visit places. For expanded noun phrases we learned the features. Expanded noun phrases describe a noun in a sentence to make it interesting. It includes the determiner, the adjective, the noun, and the preposition. E.g. the thrilled family ate their boiling food at the large table.

In Maths, we are learning to calculate the area of a shape as well as the perimeter of a compound shape. To calculate the area of a shape we measure the length and width and then we multiply them together. To find the perimeter of a compound shape we measure all of the sides and then add them together. If the shapes are regular like a square or a rectangle we take the length and the width and multiply it by two.

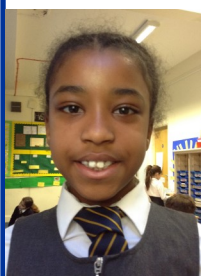

A beautiful and detailed RE display from Reception Class about the Christmas message.



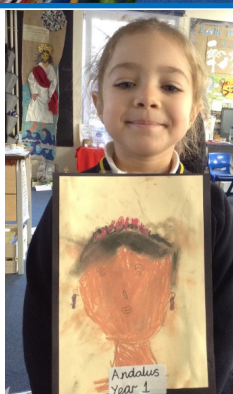
A great collection of healthy eating posters for Science class from Year 3.

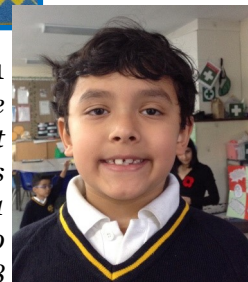
