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Year 6's Blog

Welcome to year 6's spectacular blog!

In English, we read a story called Mac's short adventure. We first made a story mountain about the story and also made a mind map (about Narrative) and we also recalled some different text types.

We took notes on characters we want and problems we can have for making our own stories. After we made our own story mountains of what we wanted our story to be about, we started to first write our Dilemma (the problem) and the Dilemma is the main problem so in our first paragraphs, we added tension and drama. Jasmine: "My story is about a girl called Bella with her cat Midnight who runs into the forest because she got scared of a loud bang and Bella also follows her and gets lost, far away from home". Aisha: "My story is about a boy called Charlie whose dream is to become a footballer but his bullies and father make him lose his courage and he feels a bit overwhelmed". A while later, we chose one paragraph to edit and we improved it by adding phrases, fronted adverbials and some short sentences.

In RE, we were talking about how rules are important and affect our lives. We made a mind map on 'Who decides?' In our mind map, we listed places that have rules and we also listed some responsibilities we have such as homework, picking up rubbish after yourself, not defacing school properties and many more! One of our tasks was to write on a sheet about rules and responsibilities in places in general etc. school, the train, the police station, the part, companies and the parliament. In our books, we answered the question 'Why do we have rules?' and Jasmines answer was "We have rules so that we can have a safe world and so we do not hurt other people's feelings or do something bad and get away with it." One of our other questions was "How do rules affect our lives?" and my answer was "Rules affect our lives by ensuring we are safe and comfortable in our community".

For DT, we made first made a mind map about graphic designs. We listed places you can find graphic designs at such as, a gallery, a museum, an exhibition and also on a billboard. Graphic designers design labels, packaging and books etc. Once we completed our mind map, we wrote some words and their meanings in art: form is how things look and typography is letters and words. After that, we had a very fun task which was to write our names in different types of fonts and then we coloured them in to express our feelings. Jasmine's was to represent that I am calm and focused and I used colours and patterns that really suited me. Content is part of a design and it is the purpose of selling an object, the concept is an idea.

In English, we learn about persuasive writing. We annotated an example of persuasive writing with key language features and text structure such as opening paragraph, opinion written as fact. Rhetorical questions, and logical conclusion. We then made a mind map about persuasive writing.

In Maths we are learning about statistics. We made a mind map about statistics where we wrote words like data, pictograph, graph, numbers and key. We also learnt that statistics has always a key, e.g **Q**=3.

In RE we asked a question about who Jesus is? Then made a mind map answering the question with what we already know about Jesus's life, his characteristics and things he did. We also looked at key vocabularies such as resurrection, eternal life hope, trust, Jesus, God, spirit, Christian, and human.

In Art we are exploring decoupage and creative design. Decoupaging is the art of decorating surfaces by applying cut-outs (as of paper) and then coating with usually several layers of finish (such as lacquer or varnish). We looked at different pictures of decoupage objects from different cultural traditions and socio economic backgrounds. Including British culture. We then made a mind map and described pictures of different objects with various patterns designs. *By Mesbah and Fatma*

Year 5's Blog

Welcome to Year 5's magnificent blog!

In English, we are learning about poems. In the lesson we read a poem called The Walrus and The Butterfly. The poem was about a walrus and a butterfly who wanted to clear the sand on the beach but they were stopped by oysters. The walrus and the butterfly, were so annoyed with them for arguing that they ate the oysters. After we

read the text we explored its use of language. Then we answered question on the text. We also compared two versions of the same poem with different characters.

In Maths, we learnt about Statistics. Statistic means diagrams which represents data (information). In this lesson we drew Line Graphs. There are 4 different types of graphs such as: scatter graph, bar graph, pie chart, and line graphs but we focused on line graphs. We had to figure out three word problems which each include line graphs.

In Geography we learnt about rivers and water cycles. In this lesson we mainly focused on the water cycle key features such as collection, evaporation, condensation, and transportation. We recreated the water cycle in a simple experiment. WE used ice cubes, two clear bowls of hot water and Clingfilm. We put the hot water in the bowl and cover the bowl with the clink film and placed the ice cubes on the cling film. The aim was to see if precipitation falls 'on land'. In our results after twenty minutes the droplets were collected in the small bowl. Finally we did a diagram of how a water cycle works in our books.

In RE we started a new topic about how Muslims live and embrace their faith in a diverse world. We made a mind map about it. We looked at the importance and significance of the shadahadah to a Muslims life. *By Kleon and Yusuf*
