## Year 6's Blog

Welcome to Year 6's fantastic news!
In Science, we have been learning about electricity and how it travels through the wires, and crocodile clips. In the 2 weeks of learning about electricity, we had to make a circuit that didn't work and write why it didn't work. After we fixed the circuit to make it work, you could also use a light bulb, buzzer, or motor. We
made a huge mind map which was full of vocabulary and some blue questions that we will answer at the end of the term.

In RE, we visited a Buddhist temple which was an amazing experience. We got to use a laser and point at different signs on the wall to ask questions about what it was. It was very relaxing because we got to cross our legs and meditate and we also rung the gong that belonged to the Buddhist people. Then we had lunch downstairs at the temple which was pretty relaxing and comfortable.
In Maths, we learned about dividing and multiplying fractions e.g. for multiplication numerator times numerator and denominator by denominator, and the same with division but there are some steps. Then we solved tricky word problems and we had to find the operations for the word problems. We also underlined the keywords in the question.

In PSHE, we learned about spending money and loans and
 also the increase rate. We had to pick one of four people
we would want to use a loan from Ms. Rachel told us it would be better to pick the less amount that you can use on the loan because you will never know if you can pay back the money that you have borrowed and pick the less amount of interest rate e.g. I borrow 1000 from the bank. The bank's interest rate might be high because the Bank of England makes the money.
In DT, we have been learning the new types of stitches that we will use to make a phone holder that will hold our phones. We have been watching videos that showed us 3 different types of stitches such as running stitches, cross stitches, and back stitches. We started to measure our phones to see how wide the thread would need to be to cover the whole phone so we could make our holders and use them home.

Welcome to our astonishing blog!
In English, we were focusing on the story of Little Red Riding Hood. We made a planning sheet that included characters, setting, problem/solution, and what elements of the fairy tale there will be. We then filled the boxes with answers. Then we wrote and drew our version of the story by changing one aspect of the known fairy tale.

In RE, we continue to learn how the Hindus worship at home. We looked at the shrines found at home. The Hindus worship and pray at home. Some the items that are in shrine are the puja trey, a bell to wake the god, a water pot an offering to the god and to wash the statue- symbol of purity, a diva lamp to symbolise enlightenment, Incense and flower, burning incense sticks fill the room with scent, symbolising the presence of the deity. Flowers are often placed in the shrine to honour the deity, and kum kum powder for making a coloured mark on the worshipper's forehead shows honour to the deity and reminds the worshipper of their devotion throughout the day.

In Science, we explored the properties of liquids. We experimented by making a race of different liquids by pouring the liquids into a clear cup. We raced golden syrup versus hand soap. We also did water versus hand soap. Lastly, we raced oil versus syrup. Before that, we wrote our predictions of which liquid will win. We found out that the hand soap, water, and olive oil were the fastest to pour into the cup.

Year 5's Blog
Welcome to Year 5's fascinating blog! In English, we are learning to write a short narrative with dialogue. Then we had 3 scenarios to choose from. One was about a fox and a rabbit. The fox wanted to eat the rabbit so he was trying to persuade the rabbit to come out of her hut. The other one was a bird and a crow fighting over leftover bread. The third one was a cat that wanted to play by herself but then the dog wanted to play with the cat. We paired up into partners and wrote a role-play with a conflict scene and we used informal language.
In Maths, we continued converting mixed numbers into improper fractions. Then we drew diagrams to make whole numbers when converting improper fractions into mixed numbers. We also moved on to a more abstract approach using division and remainders.
In Science, we carried on with the properties of materials. We identified materials that can and cannot dissolve. Sugar is a soluble material that will change its form when mixed with water. Flour, coffee grains, and rice are not soluble. We also looked at reversible changes by separating materials. We recorded our experiments on our books as a group. We used filtering and sifting to separate the materials. We separated rice from flour. We then recorded our findings.
In RE, we are still learning about Sikhism. We now moved on to understanding how equality and Sawa (selfless service ) are shown in the Langar (is the community kitchen of a Gurdwara, which serves meals to all, free of charge, regardless of religion, caste, gender, economic status, or ethnicity. ) And how Langar functions today as well as the link between Sikh beliefs about equality, Sawa and Langar. We then had a choice of two questions. The first one was, when did you experience inequality? The second one was, what do you consider inequality? We wrote our experiences and the equalities that are in the world today such as disability, racism, and body shaming.

In DT, we designed our own bread as a product for a spe-

cific occasion or person. Then we had to label our type of bread. After, we wrote a specification about what ingredients would you add to the bread. And when would you eat it? What type of bread is it? sweet or savoury? did you add any fresh or dried fruit or products?
