In Math, we are doing 2-digit with 4-digit multiplication and we have been practising lots and lots of practice questions. Some of the questions might have looked like 3 X 28 or 32 X 30. We have been doing prime numbers and factors before this topic. This topic was very fun and interesting because some of them were challenging and some of them were medium hard.

### English

In English, we have been writing and learning about passive and active voice. We have been re-writing some sentences in our books. We have also been writing the narrative of Christmas for our KS1 Nativity play with Miss Putterill.

### History

In History, we have been learning about kindertransport. Kindertransport is transport they used to send children on. Kinder means child in German. We have also listened to some biographies of some survivors of the WW2. In our most recent lesson, we have written our letters to our parents informing them of our journey to London or the countryside. Kindertransport is a very fascinating subject although it was a difficult time for parents to send their child to either London or the country-side.



### Year 4's Blog

Welcome to our fantastic blog!

In English, we

have revised pronouns. We built samples of pronouns in sentences. We then explored what it means for a piece of writing to be cohesive. And how we used pronouns to allow us to avoid repetition. We also learnt about the purpose of subheadings. We first looked at examples of different subheadings. Subheadings indicate what the paragraph or the text is going to be about. Then we were given texts to write subheadings for them.

In Maths we looked at multiples of 2, 4, & 8. We explored the link between the numbers in the timetables. We wrote the multiplication first and then we reversed it to work out the division. We found out that the inverse of multiplication is division. We also looked at multiplying and dividing the 7 times table. Finally, we looked at the link between repeated addition and multiplication.

In Art, we sketched a variety of designs in the style of William Morris. We chose four patterns and used different materials such as colored pencils, oil pastels, water colour paints, and color chalk. We are going to choose one and produce it in a bigger size.

In RE we explored why Jesus is called the Prince of Peace. In the bible, Jesus always preached about peace. We wrote stories from the bible to show his teachings about peace. The one story about the peace is the Good Samaritan where Jesus taught about kindness and forgiveness. This will bring peace to the world.

In History, we looked at the profile of a Saxon warrior, the weapons, and the uniform. We designed our own Saxon shield. We then annotated the different parts of the warrior's war gear. There were the helmet, the cloak, the spear, leg wraps, padded undershirt, and sword or/and axe. By Lyla and Sarah

In History, we were given a sheet about the Tudor people, punishment, and crime. Next, we had to match the person, punishment, and crime together. Some of the people were Emily Parker, Robert Ford, and Maud Parr. Did you know that people who were begging and people who were homeless would be pur ished by the stocks? Also, other people would watch the executions, some people brought their children to watch the executions.


