Maths

Today we played a pyramid game on whiteboards in partners. We had to have a whole number, that's a single digit, on the top of the pyramid and then partition it down into decimals. After you partitioned it once, you had to use one of the blocks to make the number on top. You must repeat this step 3 times in total so that your pyramid has 4 tiers. After that we moved onto two digit numbers and so on.

PSHE: In PSHE, we were learning about mental health. We first did a mind map and gathered ideas about what mental health includes/takes part of, then also wrote down ideas about how to keep a healthy mind set and what not to do to have an unhealthy one. Then, we did an activity in groups where we had to write down what you should do every day, sometimes, rarely, and never. An example of one of the questions were 'Should you smoke?'

ChamberMusicBox: Year 5 and 6 have been working with some professional musicians from the Chamber Box (Dave and Julia). We had been creating our own songs and then combining them to create a lovely mix of angry and calm. We have been preparing for a concert (where we perform our combined song) for around a year that took place at the St Cuthbert with St Matthias church.

Welcome to the Year 3 blog!

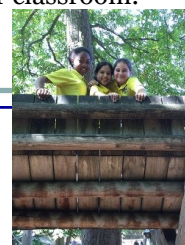
In English we learnt about fantastic Mr Fox and we were learning adverbs, adjectives, verbs and nouns. We have been revising column addition and subtraction.

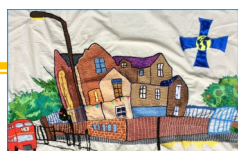
