Year 6's Blog

In English we have been learning about Anne Frank. Anne Frank is a girl who wrote a diary during World War 2. It told us how it felt being persecuted. They got persecuted because they were Jews and Hitler hated Jews. Anne Frank was bullied at school for being a Jew but she

In Science we have been learning about invertebrate groups. The groups are worms, molluscs, arthropods, echinoderms and cnidaria. Invertebrates are animals that don't have a back bone. For example: spiders, ants, snails and octopuses.

This week we have been learning some very fun things in Maths - we have been learning about addition and subtraction. First, we were doing the inverse to check our answers and some puzzling word problems.

In Topic we have been learning about crime and punishment. We did a timeline on all the eras from the Romans to modern day. Then we studied all of the gruesome crimes and punishments.
