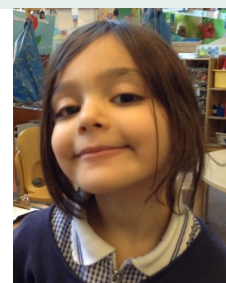

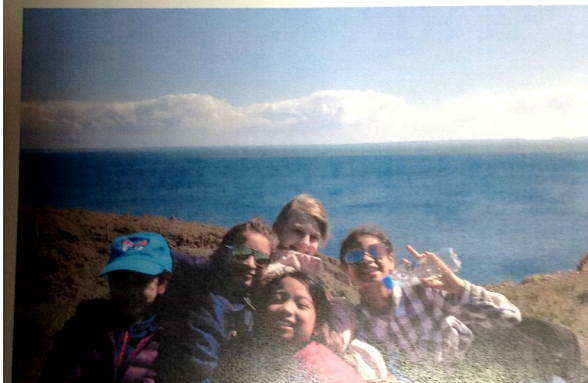

In English, we have been learning about explanation texts. We have studied texts about the life of a

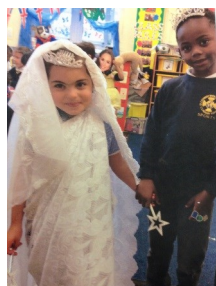

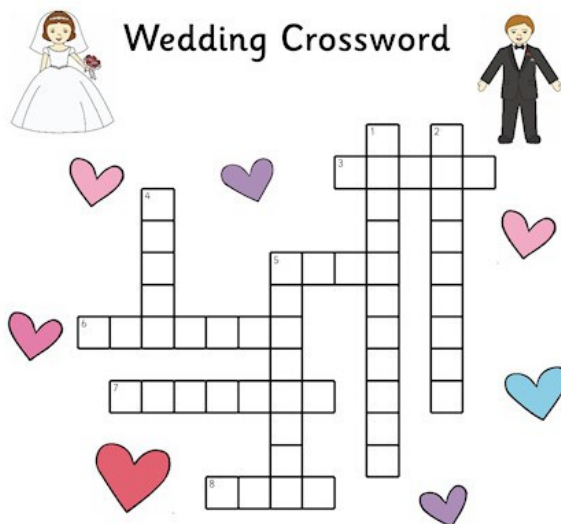

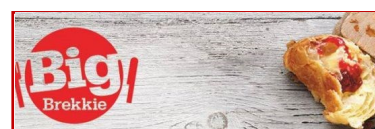

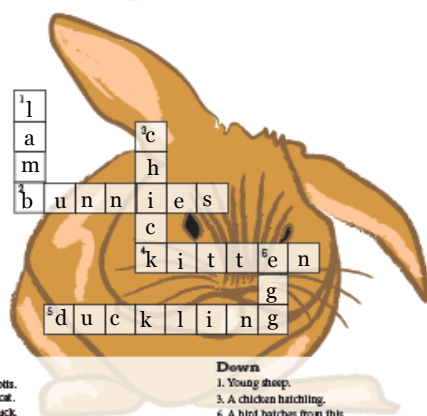
