Maths

In science we have begun a new topic on electricity. We learnt that there are two main types of electricity known as mains electricity and batteries. We also learned that electricity comes from many sources. The most common source is non-renewable energy (fossil fuels) because it is cheaper than renewable energy like hydrothermal energy which uses heat from deep in the ground.




