Year 6’s Blog!

In English, we have been learning about how to write an exemplary persuasive letter. We used a range of language features to engage the reader, we also used resources to guide our choice of vocabulary. In addition to that, we used stylistic devices for cohesion including helping to develop an idea through organisation. We all discussed what objects we required for the school. We discussed and created a detailed sketch plan to guide us. Therefore we needed to use an expanded noun phrase, effective topic sentence, top punctuation and ambitious vocabulary.

In Maths, we have been learning about algebra. We needed to understand how to use the inverse to help us. As well, we needed to re-arrange an equation to show the value of ‘x’. We also found out how to simplify an answer to show a missing value. Using algebra we solved word problems. Additionally, we learnt to read and interpret data and statistics in graphs, pie charts and tables. With this knowledge, we were able to read a line, block graphs and pie charts, summarise information in graphical format and to be able to solve problems found in graphical information.

In Humanities, we have been learning how to identify the climate zones of the world. To understand that climate zones are arranged across the Earth by latitude, to identify that the climate zones differ in terms of heat and water. As well, we learnt that weather is the state of the air at a certain time and at a certain place. Condition may be clear, cloudy, fair, rainy, humid, cold, windy, etc. To understand that people live in different climate zones and must adapt to them.

In Science, we have been learning about light. To understand that light travels in straight lines and creates shadows of the same shape that casts them, to know that light is absorbed in the eye, which is how we see it. We used some key words like: light, sun, fire, heat, shadow. To understand that light is reflected or created through heat. The shadows are shorter when the sun is higher, however when it is evening and morning, the shadows are longer because the sun is not high enough.

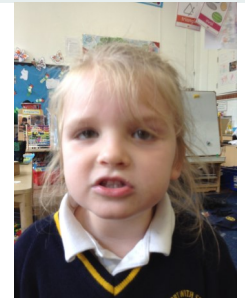
In RE, we have been learning about Buddhism. Our task was to assess what we know about Buddhism. Did you know that people who are Buddhists believe in meditation which brings them to mindfulness. We found out that Dalai Lama is the spiritual leader of Tibet. Buddhists come from the Far East, they worship in temples; they often are taught by monks.

YEAR 6 exam preparation

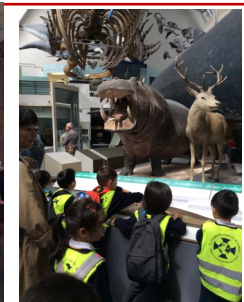
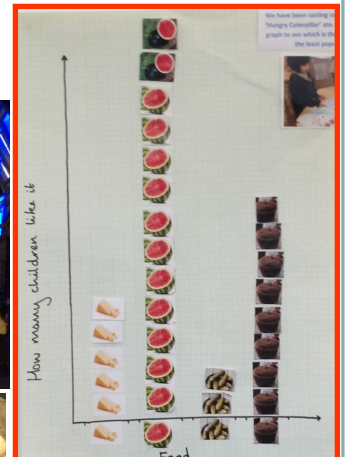

HEAD TEACHER'S LETTER

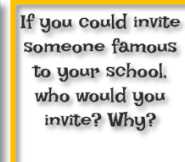
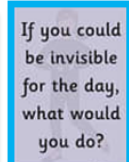
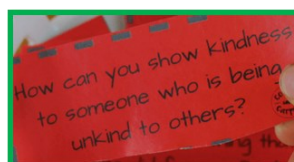
Dear St Cuthbert children and parents,

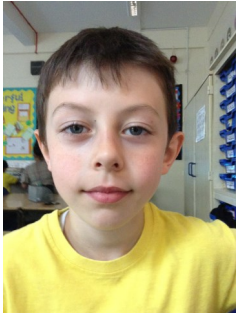
Reception Class have been flying paper planes in the play ground. They then recorded how far they flew their planes.

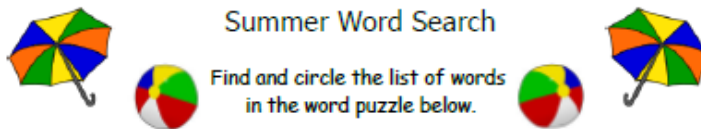
