#### Year 4's Blog



Welcome to our magnificent blog!

In English we continue to explore the book called

Henry's Freedom Box. We structured the events in the story with introduction, build up, characters, problem, settings, resolution and ending. We also wrote a personal letter in chronological order about Henry's escape. Henry wrote a letter to James, who is his friend and has helped him to escape, to tell him what happened on his way to Philadelphia. He met some kind people when he got there. We included how he might feel if his plan would fail, scared and anxious but happy and relieved when he finally arrived.

In Maths we are learning to convert mixed number to improper fractions and the other way round. Improper fractions are fractions with a numerator that is bigger than the denominator. To convert improper fraction we divide the numerator by the denominator. And to convert the improper fraction to a mix number we multiply the whole number with the denominator and add the numerator then we placed the result on the denominator and keep the same denominator. E.g.  $16/3 = 16 \div 3 = 51/3$ . 81/5 = 41/5.

In Science we wrote a letter about the dangers of electricity to an imaginary friend that has no knowledge of electricity and how it works. We explained some rules that you must do and don't. E.g. always ask an adult for help when you use the toaster and don't pull electric wire out of the socket. Always unplug it carefully.

In RE we are learning about Hindu marriage and weddings. We looked at the key features in the Hindu weddings. There are 7 steps that couples take around a fire to representing different promise such as to looking after each other, growing together and to caring for children.

In DT we did an evaluation of what went well with our home made burglar alarm. The buzzer worked when we pressed the top of the aluminium foil. It was also easy to connect the crocodile wires. What didn't go well at first we changed a few things and it worked. *By Eliza and Nathan*

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
