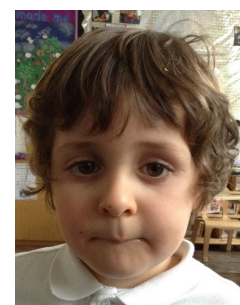
We looked up the difference between the rich and the poor people's clothes and their lifestyles.

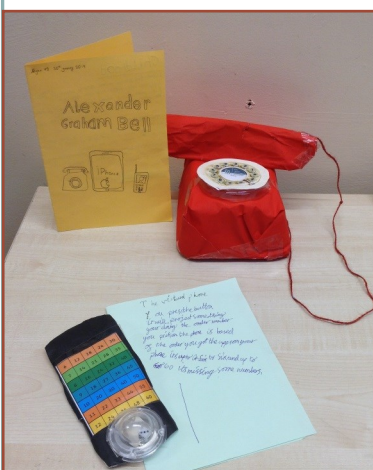


Year 4's Blog

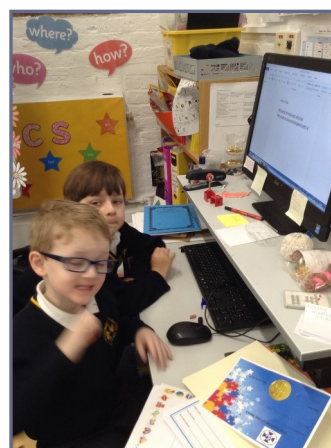

Cristiano helped Aaron with his blog this week. We were learning about old toys.

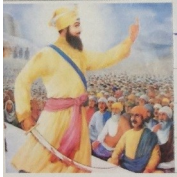
We made a cup and ball game with a cup and string. In maths we were learning about money. We did coin rubbings.

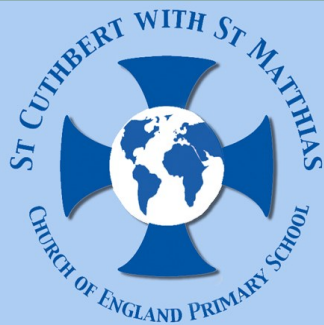

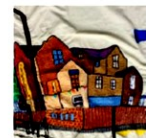
