column subtraction. We have also been doing 5 digit numbers.



Year 5's Blog

In Spanish we learned about the body parts, we drew a person then labelled it. We also wrote numbers up to 100; we learnt how to say it too. We learned how to describe a person in Spanish and our teacher gave us some characters to describe like Ron Weasly and others...

Assessments

First of all, we did our maths assessment, it was really HARD but Miss Kennedy told us to try our BEST! We had 32 questions! But we solved the REALLY easy one in 5 seconds. Our second assessment was the reading one, where we had some texts and we need to read them carefully and answer the questions - some questions were posed as: 'What do you think ...' and these are called inference questions. Finally, we had our SPAG and spelling assessments.

To wind down after using lots of brain power, Miss Kennedy gave us some Harvest Festival inspired detailed paper so that we could colour it peacefully and she put some tranquil music.

Circle time

In circle time we first gave each other compliments, then we learnt about Black History Month. We learnt that long time ago people of colour were discriminated against in certain parts of the world and they were taken into the slave trade. After that, we wrote our own questions about BMH and we gave the questions to other teams; they had to answer them to test our knowledge and understanding.

Church

On Thursday we sang in St Cuthbert's Church and celebrated Harvest Festival where we presented our bee projects and gave thanks for these compelling, life-giving creatures. The songs we sang were: Cauliflowers Fluffy, There Is a Higher Throne and Brother Sister Let Me Serve You.

SPAG

We have been learning how to embed relative clauses into sentences to add extra detail and make our sentences more complex. We learnt that relative clauses begin with either the words: who, whose, that, which, where and when. These words are called relative pronouns. Here is an example of a simple sentence: the polar bear sat on the sheet of ice. Now look at the sentence with the relative clause: the polar bear, whose fur was mangled, sat on the sheet of ice. 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
