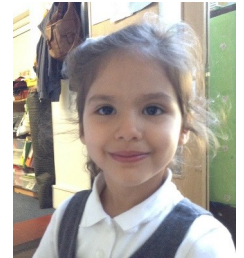

This week in RE, we have been focussing on the parable of The Good Samaritan- our school vision. We considered the following question: Why is the parable of the Good Samaritan and the associated thoughts in our school vision important to you? Some people said that it inspires them to be loving, caring and kind; whilst other said that they show some of these traits by considering their peers feelings and being compassionate. This lesson was very short but affective!

In topic we had our last lesson on rivers and the water cycle. We got given an information text about the main six stages of the water cycle which are: Collection, Evaporation and transportation, condensation, precipitation, runoff and infiltration. We answered different questions such as – what does the word 'cycle' mean, is water vapour made of pure or salty? Why? Some of the class answered 5 questions and some answered 6.

This week we were converting imperial and metric units of measure. Some examples of imperial measures are: Inches, ounces, feet and pounds. Many examples of metric units of measures are: centimetres, metres, kilos and many more. We answered many different challenges which were really hard.

In sports day we were separated into our classes and we were sitting down on mats whilst we were waiting to be sent off to our games. Year 5 started off with the bean bag throw and some of us were very good at it! We were very excited, stressed and anxious when it came to the time to start sprints and relays. We can't wait to find out the results and see how well we did in all of the activities.

In Maths, we learned about moving points on a grid; this is called translations. We did some questions giving true or false

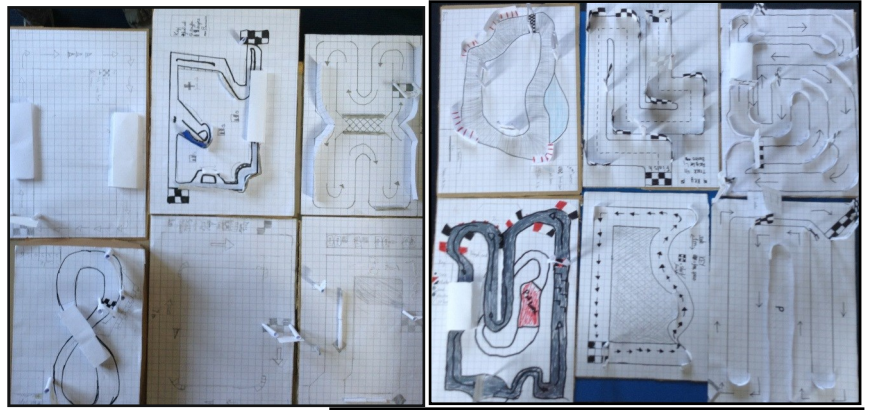
as an answer. For example, point A has been translated 6 right and 2 down to point B. This means that you had to move point A to number 2 and 6 right to point B. However, the answer was false.

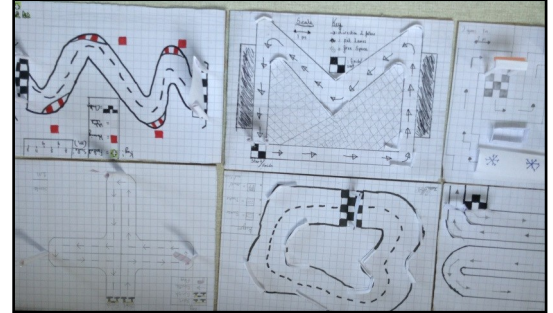

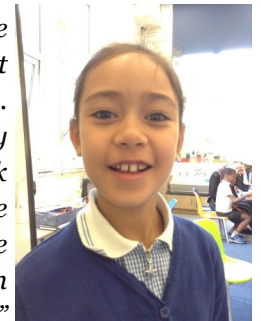
Year 5's Amazing Go-Kart tracks.



Some of Year 3 children working on the Good Samaritan collage.

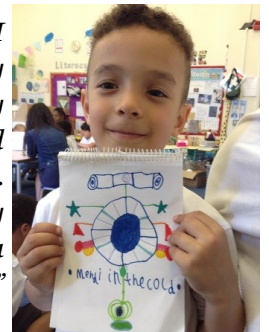


Christelle Y2, "We are learning about the Good Samaritan. He helped the Jew by putting his cloak around him when he found him hurt. He then put him in an inn."
