

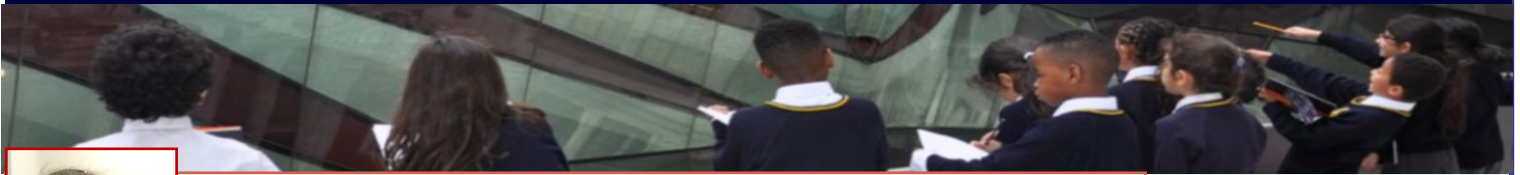
# Loving one another. Learning for our future.

## Year 6 Blog

In Maths, we have been learning multiplying multi-digit numbers up to 4 digits. After had finished we did word problems with multiplication. We also solved word problems on addition and subtraction with decimals. We subtracted 3 digit number and two digit numbers. This is an example of a money problem:

$£2.91 - £2.26 = 65p$

$£2.26 - 65p = £1.61$ .

In Science, we have moved onto a new unit on evolution and inheritance. We looked at living things and the production of offspring from the same kind, and that are identical and not identical. Inheritance is the process by which genetic information is passed on from parent to child. Evolution is change in the heritable characteristics of biological populations over successive generations. We researched Gregor Mendel (father of genetics) who discovered dominant characters from the crosses he performed on the plants in his green house. In his childhood he worked as a gardener and studied bee-keeping in his childhood. He was known for founding modern genetics.

In English we have started a new unit about Performance Poetry. A Performance Poem is a story that you perform with actions. It includes: repetition, rhyme, alliteration, metaphor and onomatopoeia etc...The poems were about Goldilocks and the Three Bears. On Thursday, we got ideas from Michael Rosen so we can preform our own performance poetry.



In D.T we designed and made our own chairs. We looked at several chair structures, we chose materials and carried out a fair test. Our design included several alternative chair ideas. We then choose the appropriate scale to incorporate a frame work and text cover. One example is: High back side chair based on a design by Charles Rennie Mackintosh in 1898. If you come into our classroom you can find our beautifully handmade chairs.

In R.E we have started a new unit on pilgrimage in general and focused on Christian pilgrimage. Pilgrimage is a journey of your life to a spiritual place. We asked questions like: who makes pilgrimage? What is more important to Christians the journey or the destination? Places for Christian pilgrimage are: Holy Lands (Israel/Palestine), St David's Cathedral, Wales and St Peter's Basilica, Rome. *By Crina and Haniya*

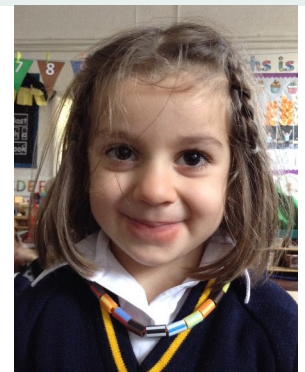

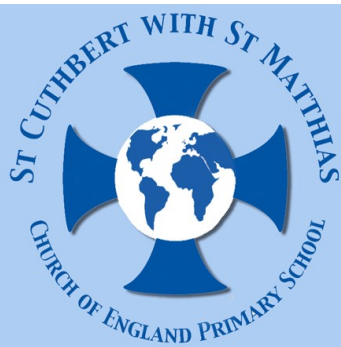


## Parent Meetings

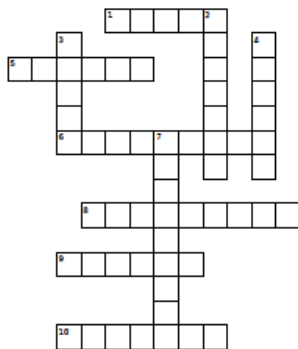

- something attached to your chimney that you can light a fire in

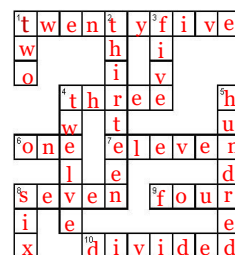
