



# Loving one another. Learning for our future.

## Year 6 Blog

In English we have been studying performance poetry. We listened to two very famous poets named Michael Rosen and Benjamin Zephaniah. One of Michael Rosen's tips were to express ourselves when performing, and not to be afraid to act silly. We also performed one of his poems in our classroom. We chose three poems to act, they were called Hot Food, The Car Trip and chocolate cake. To make our poem engaging we used different techniques such as different voices for different people and to remain in character throughout the entirety of the performance.

In Maths we learnt how to multiply 4 digit numbers by 1 and 2 digit numbers using the formal written method. We also learnt a new way of multiplication called the area model. At first everyone found this method very tricky, but after a lot of practice we understood it and it became a lot easier. The area model is when you draw a square and divide it into 4. Next you write the multiplication on the outside and then you work the answer out.

## Remembrance Day

We learnt about Remembrance Day and poppies. We learnt a few facts about poppies and one of them was that there is no correct way to wear one. A poppy is the only flower that grew on the battlefields during WWI. They are worn to remember the sacrifices of who participated in WWI and WWII. On the eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month we spent a minute of silence to remember the brave soldiers who died in battle.

In Geography we learnt where certain mountains and rivers are on the map. We built our understanding of maps by finding the location of different things using an atlas. We then plotted the continents, oceans, rivers and mountains on a world map. An example of the mountains we found are: The Andes, Himalayas the Alps and many more. In History we have been learning about the Anglo-Saxons. We drew what an Anglo-Saxon village looked like, the animals included pig, sheep, hens and a cow.


Also we have winners in our class for Black History month, they are Adeena and Hareem .I would like to say congratulations to them if you are reading it.

In Circle time, we were talking about peer pressure and we were drawing pictures of how peer pressure looks like.



## Year 5's Blog

In English we learnt personification and different types of poetry for example limericks. Limericks can come in different shapes and sizes. We also learnt about similes - some of us thought really well and said Miss Louise is as calm as the ocean. We had to use personification for a haunted

house, a leafless tree and a grave for example the sky stared at the abandoned and dark house. Every day we go into class and we find a sheet of motivating quotes and we have to write about it.

In Maths we learnt about statistics and how to use bar graphs, line graphs and pictograms. We ALSO learnt about fractions. We used a chocolate bar that had 4 parts so if two people would get two pieces each. We learnt  $\frac{1}{2} = \frac{2}{4} = \frac{3}{6} = \frac{4}{8}$  the pattern is you have to times two by the numerator and the denominator. (We might eat the chocolate) We learnt about x and y axes. We also learnt how to use them in line graphs.

In History, we are learning about crime and punishment but so far we are doing punishment in the Tudor times. For example if you commit treason the punishment would be death by being hung. The only way to prove your innocence is if you have a witness. We made poems or prayers about Remembrance Day and we did the 2 minutes in silence and made poppies out of recycling stuff. We also learnt about the history of the parliament and how Guy Fawkes tried to blow up parliament.

In Art, we are learning about portraiture and illustration. We drew our own self-portraits. Did you know that you can find magnificent and old self-portraits and portraits? You can find them all around the world especially in galleries, Museums and churches. If you look at the Mona Lisa by Leonardo da Vinci from all angles she is always looking at you! *By Ibrahim and Donia*



  - you wear these on your hands to stay warm outside




**Puzzle time**
