





Year 6's Blog

In History we have been learning about civilizations such as The Indus Valley, Ancient Egypt, Ancient Sumer and The Shang Dynasty Empire. You may have already obtained a lot of diverse facts and knowledge about Ancient Egypt but I bet you never knew any of these facts: Did you know that the Ancient Egyptians invented mathematics, paper and medicine. Although you may not think much about this, most of the things we do in our everyday lives came from The Ancient Egyptians.

During Maths we were learning about fractions. We solved a lot of different word problems and found equivalent fractions for example, if you had $\frac{1}{2}$ an equivalent fraction could be $\frac{3}{6}$ because we multiply the numerator (the top number) and the denominator (the bottom number) by 3.

In R.E. we drew artistic expressions of Christmas to share the Christian meaning, central beliefs and concept of it. Most of us drew a picture of the nativity scene. We also explored the visual meanings and reasons behind the visual representations for example, baby Jesus in the crib full of light in otherwise dark room which represents that he is holy and the king.

In Art we have been drawing self-portraits of ourselves by using a mirror. In our first attempt we drew our self-portraits without a tutorial. After this we had a second attempt using a tutorial, most of us agreed that using a tutorial produces a better result.

Year 5's Blog



In English we continue to watch David Attenborough's documentary, about South America. We learnt that you can find penguins in South America and they can dive in the sea about 1000 ft. deep. Also you can find bears in South America and they love to climb trees

to get the most ripe fruit. An interesting fact- humans are the only predators of bears. We made a mind map to write all these amazing facts down of animals and the landscapes in our books.

In Maths we have been learning about Prime numbers and composite numbers. We also multiply numbers up to 4 digit numbers by 1 digit number using formal writing method which is column multiplication. We also answered multiplication word problems. We tried to work out the missing numbers by using place value counters e.g. $\square \times 2 = 2 \square 8$ the answer is 1, 4 and 4.

In RE we looked at the religious meanings of the Christmas trees and cards. We explored what is sacred and secular in the Christmas celebrations. We found out that the nativity scene is a sacred display. Whereas the Christmas tree and cards are more secular traditions. We watched a video about when Christmas cards were invented. They were first made by an civil servant called Sir Henry Cole in 1843. We made our own Christmas cards. We chose the sacred one to make. In Czech Republic they celebrate New Year and then Christmas.

In Spanish we also learnt how to write sentence in Spanish about ourselves. We wrote down our favourite things to do, like singing, dancing, swimming, playing football, cooking and reading. We also wrote letters to children in Spain introducing ourselves. Late in Year 6 we are hoping to meet them when we go on our trip to Barcelona. Until then our teacher Miss Claro said we can be pen pals and write to each other. *By Aya and Tallulah*
