What is Social Networking?

Social networking is using internet sites to communicate or meet with other people online.

Using social network sites can be fun but can also be dangerous!

- Twitter is often used positively by schools to celebrate achievement.

- Instagram's private 1st page is actually public!
- 'Whisper' is used by people to share their thoughts and feelings anonymously—but it is phone based so is not safe to use.
- 12% of 8-11 year olds' friends are not in the real world, only online and 15% of 12-15 year olds' friends are not in the real world, only online.
- 27% of children talk about private things online rather than in person.
